

Bifurcation in Juvenile Justice



- ▶ State Responsibilities:
 - ▶ Youth Centers/Corrections
 - ▶ Parole
 - ▶ Alternative Placements
- ▶ County Responsibilities:
 - ▶ Diversion
 - ▶ Detention
 - ▶ Probation
 - ▶ County Camps
 - ▶ Alternative Placements

Differences from the Adult System



- ▶ No bail
- ▶ Only bench trials
- ▶ No public proceedings
- ▶ A finding of guilt is called an adjudication
- ▶ Sentencing for a juvenile is called/considered a disposition
- ▶ There are no guilty or not guilty pleas; a youth makes an admission
- ▶ Youth are not considered defendants; they are subject minors

 - ▶ Located in Elko
 - ▶ Budgeted Staff: 86
 - ▶ Males Only
 - ▶ 60 Beds
 - ▶ Staff Secure
 - ▶ In house education: Independence High School
 - ▶ Average length of stay for SFY 2017: 6.8 months
 - ▶ Average daily population for SFY 2017: 52

State Facilities/Youth Centers SV




- ▶ Summit View Youth Center (SVYC)
 - ▶ Located in North Las Vegas
 - ▶ Budgeted Staff: 68
 - ▶ Males Only
 - ▶ 35 Beds
 - ▶ Physically Secure
 - ▶ Education provided by Clark County School District
 - ▶ Average length of stay for SFY 2017: 7 months
 - ▶ Average daily population for SFY 2017: 35

State Facilities/Youth Centers CYC




- ▶ Caliente Youth Center (CYC)
 - ▶ Located in Caliente
 - ▶ Budgeted Staff: 100
 - ▶ 112 Total Beds
 - ▶ 64 Male; 48 Females
 - ▶ Staff Secure
 - ▶ Education provided by Lincoln County School District
 - ▶ Average length of stay for SFY 2017: 8.1 months
 - ▶ Average daily population for SFY 2017: 116

Commitments by Gender




Commitments by Race




Commitments by Race 2017




Facility Average Population by Region



Youth Parole Services

- 
- ▶ The following is a list of services provided to youth under the supervision of youth parole:
 - ▶ Substance abuse testing and treatment- individual and group sessions
 - ▶ Implement evidence based programming
 - ▶ Mediation program in collaboration with the Neighborhood Justice Center, Judiciary, Public Defender Office, District Attorney's Office with the intention of providing restorative justice
 - ▶ Partner with the local law enforcement to serve warrants for youth absconding from Youth Parole whose charges include violent behavior and weapon charges
 - ▶ Partner with school districts, probation offices, courts, community providers and stakeholders
 - ▶ Implement Quality Assurance within Youth Parole, including case audits and direct observation of field work
 - ▶ Implement the Interstate Compact for Juveniles to assist in family reunification
 - ▶ Develop a Field Training Manual to enhance field pre-service training
 - ▶ Develop and Implement Statewide Gang Training and Intervention
 - ▶ Develop and implement Statewide Juvenile Sex Offender Training




