PUBLIC AND INDIAN HOUSING

Public housing was established to provide decent and safe rental housing for eligible low-income families, the elderly, and persons with disabilities. There are approximately 1.2 million households living in public housing units, managed by some 3,300 housing authorities (HAs).

Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)

The Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program is a flexible program that provides communities with resources to address a wide range of unique community development needs. Beginning in 1974, the CDBG program is one of the longest continuously run programs at HUD. The CDBG program provides annual grants on a formula basis to 1209 general units of local government and States.

In FY16, 7 Grantees were awarded \$19,987,856 within the State of Nevada

HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME)

The HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME) provides formula grants to States and localities that communities use - often in partnership with local nonprofit groups - to fund a wide range of activities including building, buying, and/or rehabilitating affordable housing for rent or homeownership or providing direct rental assistance to low-income people.

In FY16, 5 Grantees were awarded \$8,931,309 within the State of Nevada

Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG)

To help improve the quality of emergency shelters and transitional housing for the homeless, to make available additional shelters, to meet the costs of operating shelters, to provide essential social services to homeless individuals, and to help prevent homelessness.

In FY16, 4 Grantees were awarded \$1,791,286 within the State of Nevada

Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA)

To provide housing assistance and related supportive services for low-income persons with HIV/AIDS and their families.

In FY16, 2 Grantees were awarded 1,428,075 within the State of Nevada

CPD Competitive Grants

Continuum of Care (CoC) Grant

The CoC Program (24 CFR part 578) is designed to promote a community-wide commitment to the goal of ending homelessness; to provide funding for efforts by nonprofit providers, States, and local governments to quickly re-house homeless individuals, families, persons fleeing domestic violence, and youth while minimizing the trauma and dislocation caused by homelessness; to promote access to and effective utilization of mainstream programs by homeless; and to optimize self-sufficiency among those experiencing homelessness.
