CREATION

The Legislative Committee on Senior Citizens, Veterans and Adults With Special Needs is authorized by *Nevada Revised Statutes* (NRS) 218E.750.

MEMBERS

The Committee is comprised of six legislators—three members from the Senate and three members from the Assembly. The chair and vice chair are selected by the Legislative Commission.

COMMITTEE RESPONSIBILITIES

The powers and duties of the Committee are codified in NRS 218E.750. The Committee is charged with reviewing, studying, and commenting on issues relating to senior citizens, veterans, and adults with special needs, including, but not limited to the following:

- Initiatives to ensure the financial and physical wellness of senior citizens, veterans, and adults with special needs;
- The abuse, neglect, isolation, and exploitation of senior citizens and adults with special needs;
- Public outreach and advocacy;
- Programs for the provision of services to senior citizens, veterans, and adults with special needs and methods to enhance such programs to ensure services are provided in the most appropriate setting;
- Programs that provide services and care to senior citizens in the home; thereby, allowing them to remain at home and live independently, as opposed to being placed institutional care;
- The availability of useful information and data as needed for the State to effectively make decisions, plan budgets, and monitor costs and outcomes of services provided to senior citizens, veterans, and adults with special needs;
- Laws relating to the appointment of a guardian and the improvement of laws for the protection of senior citizens and adults with special needs who have been appointed a guardian, including the improvement of investigations relating to guardianships and systems for monitoring guardianships; and
- The improvement of facilities for long-term care in Nevada, including the following:

- Reducing the number of persons placed in facilities for long-term care located outside Nevada;
- Creating units for acute care and long-term care to treat persons suffering from dementia who exhibit behavioral problems;
- Developing alternatives to placement in facilities for long-term care, including units for long-term care located in other types of facilities and ensuring that such alternatives are available throughout Nevada for the treatment of persons with psychological needs; and
- o Creating a program to provide follow-up care and track the ongoing progress of residents of facilities for long-term care.

PAST COMMITTEE ACTION

At the conclusion of the 2015–2016 Interim, the Committee submitted seven of its ten allocated bill draft requests (BDRs) to the 2017 Legislative Session.
