Financial Literacy: SB 249


- SB 249 became effective July 1, 2017
- CCSD awarded \$700,000 on March 2, 2018
- Connection to revised Social Studies
 Nevada Academic Content Standards
 (NVACS)
- Impacts grades three to twelve





Challenges

- Timelines for funding... only received approval with funds on March 2, 2018
- Standards for financial literacy component of Social Studies Nevada Academic Content Standards added in December 2017
- Limited staff to work on project





Financial Literacy Task Force

- Teachers creating lesson plans to utilize resources purchased through grant
- Teachers assisting in designing financial literacy symposiums









Financial Literacy Micro-credentialing

- 100 teachers to earn micro-credential
- "EVERFI Financial Education Certified Teacher" – private BloomBoard course developed for CCSD
- Resources provided by EverFi
- Aligned to Social Studies Nevada Academic Content Standards (NVACS) for financial literacy
- Creating financial literacy expert teachers in CCSD

Timeline: April 5, 2018





Financial Literacy Symposiums

 Nevada State Treasurer Officer Financial Literacy Summit targeted to grades three to twelve – 300 teachers

Timeline: May 5, 2018

• Elementary Financial Literacy Symposium targeted to all elementary teachers – 600 teachers

Timeline: June 11, 2018

 Secondary Financial Literacy Symposium targeted to all social studies teachers – 600 teachers

Timeline: June 12, 2018

Financial Literacy E-books



- 20 e-books correlated to financial literacy standards for all elementary schools
- 30 e-books correlated to financial literacy standards for all middle and high schools
- Lessons will be created by the taskforce utilizing these resources.

- Canvas course available to teachers supporting financial literacy in the classroom

- FY 19 will focus on the change in high school graduation requiring a course on economics for July 1, 2022.
- Trainings will be provided for high school social studies teachers.
- Materials will be procured for economics instruction aligned to Nevada Academic Content Standards (NVACS).
