STATUTORY AUTHORITY

- Housed within the Records, Communications and Compliance Division (RCCD) of DPS (NRS 480.130, 480.140, 179A.075)
 - Collect and maintain records, reports, and compilations of statistical data submitted by each agency of criminal justice and any other agency dealing with juvenile delinquency
 - Collect, maintain, and arrange all information regarding:
 - ✓ Records of criminal history
 - ✓ DNA profile of a person from whom a biological specimen was obtained
 - Use a record of personal identifying information (biometric) of a subject as the basis for maintaining any records regarding him/her



CRIMINAL JUSTICE FUNCTIONS

- Centralized storage facility for Nevada Arrest and Disposition Records
- Fingerprint-based background checks for employment, licensing, and individuals providing services to vulnerable populations (various State and Federal statutes)
- Nevada Offense Codes program
- FBI CJIS Systems Agency for State of Nevada (28 CFR Part 20)
- NCJIS Compliance Unit (Training and Auditing) (28 CFR Part 20)



OTHER SERVICES

- State Sex Offender Registry (NRS 179B, 179D)
- Point of Contact Program for firearms transfers (18 USC 922 (g, n))
- Name-based background checks for employment purposes (NRS 179A)
- Uniform Crime Reporting Program
 - ✓ Arrests (NRS 179A.078)
 - ✓ Domestic Violence Protection Order Registry (NRS 179A.350)
 - ✓ Elder Abuse Reporting Repository (NRS 179A.450)



INFORMATION SECURITY UNIT

- Security Point of Contact to the FBI's Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division and to Enterprise IT Services (EITS)
- Documents technical compliance with FBI and State Security Policies to ensure confidentiality, integrity, and availability of criminal justice and departmental information.
- Documents and provides assistance for implementing securityrelated controls for systems that interact with FBI CJIS Systems, NCJIS, and other DPS systems.
- Reports security breaches / issues to FBI CJIS Division, Enterprise IT Services, and/or DPS Director, depending on the issue.
- Resource for DPS Divisions and Nevada criminal justice agencies when designing, modifying, and decommissioning electronic systems.




NEVADA CRIMINAL JUSTICE INFORMATION SYSTEM

- Nevada Criminal Justice Information System (NCJIS): the computerized information system created to serve all state, federal, and local law enforcement and criminal justice agencies in Nevada that require criminal justice information
- Conduit through which Nevada criminal justice agencies access information systems of Nevada criminal justice agencies, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, other states, and international criminal justice agencies (e.g., Interpol, RCMP)
- Managed by the Central Repository within RCCD
- IT services and support provided by Enterprise IT Services, a division of the Department of Administration

NCJIS MODERNIZATION

- Began in FY 2012 with a study to examine the best path forward to modernize critical systems within NCJIS, to include:
 - Computerized Criminal History (CCH) System
 - Parole and Probation's Offender Tracking Information System (OTIS)
 - Temporary Protection Orders
 - Law Enforcement Message Switch (Justice Link)
- 2014- 2015 Biennium
 - Middleware and back-end systems upgraded
 - Defined requirements for CCH and OTIS replacements
- 2016-2017 Biennium
 - CCH requirements and coding begun
 - OTIS requirements and coding begun
 - TPO requirements gathered
 - Message switch upgraded



NCJIS MODERNIZATION, CONT.

- 2018-2019 Biennium
 - CCH Phase 1 go-live scheduled for April 8, 2018
 - OTIS go-live scheduled for June 30, 2018
 - TPO go-live scheduled for April 15, 2018
 - Identify a new message switch vendor
- 20-21 Biennium
 - Implement new message switch
 - Replace the three background check systems of the RCCD Records Bureau (Civil Applicant, Civil Name Check, Point of Contact)
 - Replace Records Bureau's accounting system
 - Document management
 - User Portal
- 22-23 Biennium
 - Warrants system replacement
 - User requests from Nevada criminal justice agencies
 - Disaster Recovery
 - Application refresh



DISPOSITION BACKFILL HISTORY

In October 2013:

- Total arrests without dispositions = 1,249,731
- Only 29 Courts reporting to the Repository
- By December 2013 received 799,147 dispositions
- Began outreach to request submission of missing dispositions from all courts, which produced even more dispositions, bringing the total to > 900k



DISPOSITION BACKFILL HISTORY



CURRENT DISPO STATUS

- All Nevada courts are reporting consistently
- Eliminated backfill mostly, with exception of a few stragglers
- Data entry current on "current" dispositions
- Records completion has improved to 59% compared with 23% in 2014
 - Total arrests as of 03/20/18 = 2,142,539
 - Total arrests with dispositions as of 03/20/18 = 1,270,408

DNA Expungement Process

- 1. Log receipt of application.
- 2. Review application for accuracy.
- If required information is not included then return application with a letter that lets the subject know additional information is required.
- If required information is included, forward application to the Lab via secured method (through the Law Enforcement Electronic Portal – LEEP).
- 5. Staff waits for the Lab's response.
- 6. Compliance letter is mailed to the subject.
