Angora Fire

- Started: June 24, 2007
- Cause: Illegal campfire at Seneca Pond
 - Contained: July 2, 2007
 - Acres Burned: 3100
- Destroyed 254 homes and structures





California-Nevada Tahoe Basin Fire Commission

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- Formed: August 2007
- Task: Review laws, practices and policies affecting Tahoe's wildfire vulnerability
 - Due Date for findings: March 21, 2008
- Report: 48 findings with 90 specific recommendations
- 2009 Legislature- AB 75 (Later codified in NRS 528.150)



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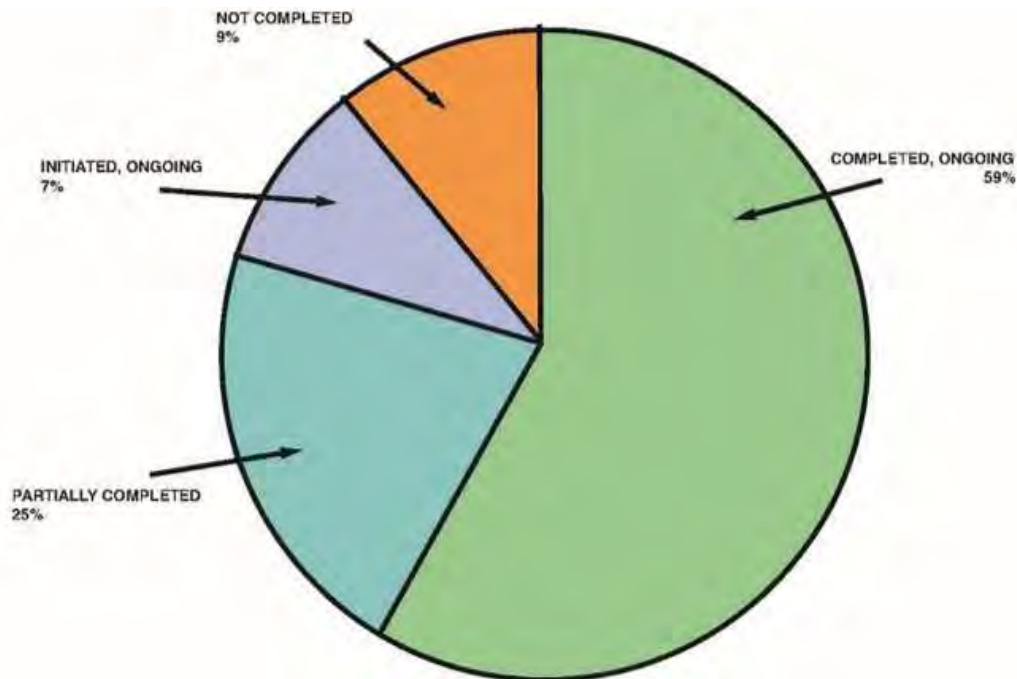
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Accomplishments



- Tahoe Fire and Fuels Team formation
 - Lake Tahoe Basin Community Wildfire Protection Plan update
 - 10 Year Multi Jurisdictional Fuel Reduction and Wildfire Strategy update
 - 1,100 acres of reforestation and 2,000 feet of stream channel restoration in Angora burn
 - Nevada side treatments- 29,643 acres (2007-2017)



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Continued Primary Focus Areas

- Increase the size and scale of hazardous fuel reduction, forest and rangeland health, and watershed protection projects across jurisdictional boundaries focusing on priority landscapes
 - Eastern Spooner Landscape Restoration (300 acres)
 - Urban lots
 - Tahoe West Initiative
- Safe, effective, and efficient wildfire response working with state, federal and local partners
- Create sustainable biomass utilization industries in Nevada
- Increase native seed collection and out-planting for conservation and restoration projects
- Increase outreach, education and landowner action for Nevadans through the full implementation of the Nevada Fire Adapted Communities Program
- Long term restoration/rehabilitation funding and commitment
- Continued coordination/collaboration to accomplish goals.
