Chiropractic Physicians' Board of Nevada

Nevada Revised Statutes Chapter 634

Board members (NRS 634.020)—The Board consists of seven members appointed by the Governor, as follows:

- Four members who are graduates of chiropractic schools or colleges, licensed under Chapter 634 of NRS, and engaged in the practice of chiropractic in Nevada for at least three years prior to appointment;
- One member who represents the interests of persons or agencies that provide health care to indigent, uninsured, or low income patients; and
- Two members who represent the general public as provided by statute.

NRS 634.023 provides that Board members serve terms of four years, are limited to two consecutive full terms, and may be removed by the Governor for good cause.

Powers and duties of the Board—The Board:

- Shall adopt reasonable regulations for the transaction of business and to carry out its duties under NRS 634;
- May inspect the premises of a licensee or authorize an agent of the Board to conduct such inspections;
- May issue subpoenas;
- May delegate to a hearing officer or hearing panel its authority to take disciplinary action, impose fines, and deposit money from those fines in financial institutions in Nevada;
- Shall deposit money from fines in the State General Fund, if the Board does not authorize a hearing officer or panel to take disciplinary action;
- Shall exam and license qualified applicants;
- May without examination grant a temporary license to a person who holds a corresponding license or certificate in another jurisdiction;
- May charge fees not to exceed amounts as provided in statute;
- Shall establish a preceptor program to provide supervised clinical experience to students enrolled in chiropractic colleges; and

NRS 634.160 provides a complaint must be reviewed either by the president or a Board member designated by the president.

Operations of the Board—The Board:

- May fix a salary for Board members of not more than \$150 per day. Members may receive per diem allowance and travel expenses;
- Shall appoint an executive director and fix compensation;
- May maintain as many offices in Nevada as it deems necessary; and
- May employ attorneys, investigators, consultants, and support personnel.

Background

Legislation:

- 1923—Senate Bill 17 (Chapter 23, *Statutes of Nevada*)—Created the Nevada State Board of Chiropractic Examiners, consisting of three members; defined chiropractic; provided for curriculum, examination, and licensing; provided that any violation of the act is a misdemeanor; grandfathered in individuals practicing in Nevada prior to enactment; and established fees;
- 1929—Assembly Bill 210 (Chapter 172, *Statutes of Nevada*)—Revised examination requirements to include specific courses and number of hours of instruction and increased fees;
- 1949—AB 358 (Chapter 322, *Statutes of Nevada*)—Increased the Board from three members to five; revised qualifications of members; defined chiropractic-physiotherapy; revised eligibility for examination; repealed provisions for licensure without examination and reciprocity; and required an annual financial report to the Governor;
- 1977—AB 278 (Chapter 530, *Statutes of Nevada*)—Increased the Board from five members to six by adding one member to represent the general public;
- 1983—SB 80 (Chapter 177, *Statutes of Nevada*)—Revised the hearing process and disciplinary actions and provided for judicial review of the Board's order;
- 1997—AB 309 (Chapter 227, *Statutes of Nevada*)—Changed the name of the Board to Chiropractic Physicians' Board of Nevada;

- 2003—SB 310 (Chapter 213, *Statutes of Nevada*)—Revised the Board membership to require that one member must represent the interests of persons or agencies that provide health care to indigent, uninsured, or low income patients; and
- 2005—SB 174 (Chapter 502, *Statutes of Nevada*)—Increased the Board membership from six members to seven by adding another representative of the general public; increased certain fees; and provided that any practitioner of chiropractic who does not maintain liability insurance must notify patients of such.

ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATIONS.

Practice before Board, NAC 634.610-634.775

NRS 634.020 Creation; number, appointment and qualifications of members.

- 1. The Chiropractic Physicians' Board of Nevada, consisting of seven members appointed by the Governor, is hereby created.
 - 2. The Governor shall appoint:
 - (a) Four members who are:
- (1) Graduates of chiropractic schools or colleges giving a course of study embracing the following subjects: Anatomy, bacteriology, chiropractic theory and practice, diagnosis or analysis, elementary chemistry and toxicology, histology, hygiene and sanitation, obstetrics and gynecology, pathology, physiology and symptomatology;
 - (2) Licensed under this chapter; and
- (3) Actually engaged in the practice of chiropractic in this State and who have been so engaged in this State for at least 3 years preceding their appointment.
- (b) One member who represents the interests of persons or agencies that regularly provide health care to patients who are indigent, uninsured or unable to afford health care. This member may be licensed under the provisions of this chapter.
- (c) Two members who are representatives of the general public. A member appointed pursuant to this paragraph must not be:
 - (1) A chiropractor or a chiropractor's assistant; or
- (2) The spouse or the parent or child, by blood, marriage or adoption, of a chiropractor or a chiropractor's assistant.
- 3. At least two of the appointees must have had a course in physiotherapy in a school or college of chiropractic. Not more than two persons who are resident graduates of the same school or college of chiropractic may serve simultaneously as members of the Board.

Ch. 213, Stats. 2003, which amended this section to revise the qualifications of certain members of the Chiropractic Physicians' Board of Nevada, contains the following provision not included in NRS:

"The amendatory provisions of this act do not abrogate or affect the current term of office of any member of a board or commission who is serving in that term on October 1, 2003."

Ch. 502, Stats. 2005, which amended this section to add to the Chiropractic Physicians' Board of Nevada an additional member who is a representative of the general public, contains the following provision not included in NRS:

"The Governor shall appoint to the Chiropractic Physicians' Board of Nevada the additional representative of the general public required by paragraph (c) of subsection 2 of NRS 634.020, as amended by section 3 of this act, to a term that begins on November 1, 2005, and expires on October 31, 2009."

Subsection 4 previously contained in this section was moved in revision to subsection 3 of NRS 634.070.

NRS 634.023 Term of office; limitation on consecutive terms; removal from Board.

- 1. The term of office of each member of the Board is 4 years.
- 2. No member of the Board may serve more than two consecutive full terms. If a person was appointed to fill an

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unexpired term of more than 2 years, the person shall be deemed to have served a full term.

3. The Governor may remove any member of the Board for good cause. (Added to NRS by 1993, 327)

NRS 634.025 Salary of members; per diem allowance and travel expenses of members and employees.

- 1. Each member of the Board is entitled to receive:
- (a) A salary of not more than \$150 per day, as fixed by the Board, while engaged in the business of the Board; and
- (b) A per diem allowance and travel expenses at a rate fixed by the Board, while engaged in the business of the Board. The rate must not exceed the rate provided for state officers and employees generally.
- 2. While engaged in the business of the Board, each employee of the Board is entitled to receive a per diem allowance and travel expenses at a rate fixed by the Board. The rate must not exceed the rate provided for state officers and employees generally.

NRS 634.030 Officers; regulations.

- 1. The Board shall elect a President, Vice President and a Secretary. The Secretary shall serve also as Treasurer of the Board.
- 2. The Board shall adopt reasonable regulations for the transaction of business and to enable it to carry out its duties under this chapter.

Election of officers, NAC 634.140

NRS 634.040 Meetings: Regular meetings; emergency meetings; notice; location.

- 1. The Board shall hold regular meetings to transact business semiannually. Emergency meetings may be called by the President or by any three members.
- 2. Except in an emergency, written notice of each meeting must be given at least 3 working days before the meeting. The notice must include the time, place, location and agenda of the meeting.
 - 3. Each meeting must be held in this State at a place designated by the President and the Secretary.

NRS 634.042 Special meeting of Board: Costs; limitations.

- 1. The costs of any special meeting held by the Board at the request of an institution, organization, chiropractic physician or an applicant for any license or certificate issued pursuant to the provisions of this chapter must be paid by the person or entity requesting the meeting.
- 2. A special meeting may not be held pursuant to such a request unless the person or entity requesting the meeting has submitted to the Board a deposit of money sufficient to defray the expenses of the meeting.

NRS 634.043 Appointment and compensation of Executive Director; offices; additional employees; inspection of premises of holder of license or certificate.

- 1. The Board shall appoint an Executive Director who serves at the pleasure of the Board and is entitled to receive such compensation as may be fixed by the Board.
 - 2. The Board may:
- (a) Maintain offices in as many localities in the State as it finds necessary to carry out the provisions of this chapter.
- (b) Employ attorneys, investigators and other professional consultants and clerical personnel necessary to the discharge of its duties.
- 3. The Board or any agent of the Board may enter any premises in this State where a person who holds a license or certificate issued pursuant to the provisions of this chapter practices chiropractic or as a chiropractor's assistant and inspect it to determine whether a violation of any provision of this chapter has occurred, including, without limitation, an inspection to determine whether any person at the premises is practicing chiropractic or as a chiropractor's assistant without the appropriate license or certificate issued pursuant to the provisions of this chapter.

NRS 634.044 Subpoenas.

- 1. For the purposes of this chapter, the Secretary or President of the Board may issue subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of books and papers.
- 2. If any witness refuses to attend or testify or produce any books and papers as required by the subpoena, the Secretary or President of the Board may report to the district court by petition, setting forth that:
- (a) Due notice has been given of the time and place of attendance of the witness or the production of the books and papers;
 - (b) The witness has been subpoenaed by the Board pursuant to this section; and
- (c) The witness has failed or refused to attend or produce the books and papers required by the subpoena before the Board which is named in the subpoena, or has refused to answer questions propounded to him or her, and asking for an order of the court compelling the witness to attend and testify or produce the books and papers before the Board.
- 3. Upon such a petition, the court shall enter an order directing the witness to appear before the court at a time and place to be fixed by the court in its order, the time to be not more than 10 days from the date of the order, and then and there show cause why the witness has not attended or testified or produced the books or papers before the Board. A certified copy of the order must be served upon the witness.
- 4. If it appears to the court that the subpoena was regularly issued by the Board, the court shall enter an order that the witness appear before the Board at the time and place fixed in the order and testify or produce the required books or papers, and upon failure to obey the order the witness must be dealt with as for contempt of court.

NRS 634.045 Fiscal year. The Board shall operate on the basis of a fiscal year commencing on July 1 and terminating on June 30.

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(Added to NRS by <u>1963</u>, <u>152</u>)

NRS 634.050 Deposit and use of money; delegation of authority to take disciplinary action; deposit of fines; claims for attorney's fees and costs of investigation.

- 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 3, all money collected by the Board must be deposited in banks, credit unions or savings and loan associations in the State of Nevada, and must be used by the Board to defray its legitimate expenses.
- 2. The Board may delegate to a hearing officer or panel its authority to take any disciplinary action pursuant to this chapter, impose and collect fines therefor and deposit the money therefrom in banks, credit unions or savings and loan associations in this State.
- 3. If a hearing officer or panel is not authorized to take disciplinary action pursuant to subsection 2 and the Board deposits the money collected from the imposition of fines with the State Treasurer for credit to the State General Fund, it may present a claim to the State Board of Examiners for recommendation to the Interim Finance Committee if money is needed to pay attorney's fees or the costs of an investigation, or both.

NRS 634.055 Records: General requirements; certain records relating to applicant or licensee deemed confidential; disclosure to other agencies; notice of disclosure.

- 1. The Board shall keep a record of its proceedings relating to licensing and disciplinary actions. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 634.214, the records must be open to public inspection at all reasonable times and must contain the name, known place of business and residence, and the date and number of the license of every chiropractor licensed under this chapter. The Board may keep such other records as it deems desirable.
- 2. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection and NRS 239.0115, all information pertaining to the personal background, medical history or financial affairs of an applicant or licensee which the Board requires to be furnished to it under this chapter, or which it otherwise obtains, is confidential and may be disclosed in whole or in part only as necessary in the course of administering this chapter or upon the order of a court of competent jurisdiction. The Board may, under procedures established by regulation, permit the disclosure of this information to any agent of the Federal Government, of another state or of any political subdivision of this State who is authorized to receive it.
- 3. Notice of the disclosure and the contents of the information disclosed pursuant to subsection 2 must be given to the applicant or licensee who is the subject of that information.

NRS 634.160 Filing of written complaint against person practicing chiropractic; retention of complaints.

- 1. The Board or any of its members who become aware that any one or a combination of the grounds for initiating disciplinary action may exist as to a person practicing chiropractic in this State shall, and any other person who is so aware may, file a written complaint specifying the relevant facts with the Executive Director of the Board. A complaint may be filed anonymously. If a complaint is filed anonymously, the Board may accept the complaint but may refuse to consider the complaint if anonymity of the complainant makes processing the complaint impossible or unfair to the person who is the subject of the complaint.
- 2. The Board shall retain all complaints filed with the Executive Director pursuant to this section for at least 10 years, including, without limitation, any complaints not acted upon.

NRS 634.170 Complaint to be considered by President or designee; notice of hearing; discussion of insufficient complaints by Board.

1. When a complaint is filed with the Executive Director of the Board, it must be considered by the President or

a member of the Board designated by the President. If, from the complaint or from other official records, it appears that the complaint may be well founded in fact, the Executive Director shall cause written notice of the charges in the complaint to be served upon the person charged at least 20 days before the date fixed for the hearing. If the Board receives a report pursuant to subsection 5 of NRS 228.420, a hearing must be held within 30 days after receiving the report.

2. If the complaint is not deemed by the President or designated member of the Board to be of sufficient import or sufficiently well founded to merit bringing proceedings against the person charged, the complaint must be held in abeyance and discussed at the next meeting of the Board.

NRS 634.190 Hearing; authorized disciplinary action; disposition of fines; private reprimands prohibited; orders imposing discipline deemed public records.

- 1. The person charged is entitled to a hearing before the Board, but the failure of the person charged to attend a hearing or to defend himself or herself does not delay or void the proceedings. The Board may, for good cause shown, continue any hearing from time to time.
 - 2. If the Board finds the person guilty as charged in the complaint, it may by order:
 - (a) Place the person on probation for a specified period or until further order of the Board.
 - (b) Administer to the person a public reprimand.
 - (c) Limit the practice of the person to, or by the exclusion of, one or more specified branches of chiropractic.
- (d) Suspend the license of the person to practice chiropractic for a specified period or until further order of the Board.
 - (e) Revoke the license of the person to practice chiropractic.
- (f) Impose a fine of not more than \$5,000 for each act which constitutes a ground for disciplinary action, which must be deposited with the State Treasurer for credit to the State General Fund.
- The order of the Board may contain such other terms, provisions or conditions as the Board deems proper and which are not inconsistent with law.
- 3. If the Board finds that a licensee has violated the provisions of <u>NRS 439B.425</u>, the Board shall suspend the license for a specified period or until further order of the Board.
 - 4. The Board shall not administer a private reprimand.
- 5. An order that imposes discipline and the findings of fact and conclusions of law supporting that order are public records.

NRS 634.193 Disciplinary action by hearing officer or panel: Procedural requirements; powers and duties of officer or panel; appeals.

- 1. Any disciplinary action taken by a hearing officer or panel pursuant to <u>NRS 634.050</u> is subject to the same procedural requirements which apply to disciplinary actions taken by the Board, and the officer or panel has those powers and duties given to the Board in relation thereto.
- 2. A decision of the hearing officer or panel relating to the imposition of a fine is a final decision in a contested case. Any party aggrieved by a decision of the officer or panel to place a licensee on probation or revoke or suspend a license may appeal that decision to the Board.

Introduction

The practice of chiropractic is a learned profession, affecting public safety and welfare and charged with the public interest, and is, therefore, subject to protection and regulation by the State through the licensing, investigative, and enforcement activities of the Board.

The Board has been recognized nationally as a leading board of chiropractic medicine by the Federation of Chiropractic Licensing Boards (FCLB) through the FCLB's awarding of the Pennebaker/Wiley Outstanding Chiropractic Licensing Board Award to the Board in 2013 and 2016. Furthermore, in May 2017 Dr. Maggie Colucci, D.C. became the first female president of the FCLB in its 91-year history. Dr Benjamin S. Lurie was elected in July 2017 as the District IV Director for the NBCE. Dr Jason O. Jaeger holds adjunct faculty positions at Southern California University of Health Sciences, Cleveland Chiropractic College, Parker University, and Palmer Chiropractic University. Dr. Jaeger is a professional speaker and has lectured throughout the United States, Europe, and Australia on spinal biomechanics, research and the clinical work he has performed. Additionally, the Board's statutes and regulations related to the licensure of chiropractor's assistants are used as a pattern nationwide by other states.

I. The Chiropractic Physicians' Board of Nevada

The Chiropractic Physicians' Board of Nevada was created in 1923. The Board enforces NRS and NAC chapters 634 which taken together authorize the Board to reasonably ensure that the citizens of Nevada receive competent chiropractic care from properly educated and licensed chiropractors. Without examination of basic knowledge and required continuing education throughout the careers of Nevada's chiropractors, Nevadans would be at risk of receiving substandard services.

VI. Created by What Authority

The Board was created in 1923 by the Nevada State Legislature for the protection of the public and chiropractic patients in particular in an effective, fair, and accountable manner. The Board presently enforces NRS and NAC chapters 634 as well as NRS 629. The Board regulates the standards of conduct for the profession, reviews complaints, and takes disciplinary action against chiropractors and chiropractor's assistants who have violated the statutes or regulations. The Board develops and designs the jurisprudence examination for the licensing of chiropractors, and renews their licenses on a biennial basis. The Board also develops and designs the jurisprudence and chiropractor's assistant exams, which are administered twice each year, and renews their certificates on a biennial basis. The Board also reviews continuing education applications from providers to allow Nevada chiropractor's and chiropractor's assistants to obtain continuing education credits.

VII. Authority to Adopt Regulations and Citation to Regulations

The Board's authority to adopt regulations is found at NRS 634.030. Pursuant to this authority, the Board has created a set of regulations presently codified as NAC chapter 634.

X. Governing Structure of the Board

Pursuant to NRS 634.020, the Board is composed of seven members appointed by the Governor. Board membership is comprised of four members who are graduates of chiropractic schools or colleges giving a course of study embracing the following subjects: Anatomy, bacteriology, chiropractic theory and practice, diagnosis or analysis, elementary chemistry and toxicology, histology, hygiene and sanitation, obstetrics and gynecology, pathology, physiology and symptomatology; Licensed under this chapter; and actually engaged in the practice of chiropractic in this State and who have been so engaged in this State for at least 3 years preceding their appointment; One member who represents the interests of persons or agencies that regularly provide health care to patients who are indigent, uninsured or unable to afford health care. This member may be licensed under the provisions of this chapter; and two members who are representatives of the general public.

The Board meets quarterly, alternating its meetings as it can between meeting sites in Las Vegas and Reno. The Board will hold special meetings as needed, usually to conduct disciplinary hearings. When the volume of the Board's work allows, some meetings are held telephonically or via video conference to conserve Board funds.

XII. Statement of the Objectives and Programs of the Board


The Board's objectives are to fulfill its various duties for the protection of the health, safety, and welfare of Nevada's chiropractic patients. Following is a discussion of the Board's five objectives and a demonstration of how the Board has been, presently is, and intends to meet each objective.

LICENSING

STATEMENT OF OBJECTIVE: The Board's objective regarding licensure is to license all qualified applicants promptly and courteously.

The Board licenses chiropractors after determining that they have attained the necessary education and have passed both the requisite national examination and the Board's jurisprudence examination. However, pursuant to NRS 634.080 – 634.090 an applicant must file an application not less than 60 days before the date of the jurisprudence examination. For qualified applicants who do not have derogatory information in their background, the Board issues an initial license immediately following the passing of the jurisprudence examination. Pursuant NRS 634.130 chiropractors must renew their license biennially accompanied by 36 hours of continuing education.

The Board's licensee count continues steady growth year over year. The present number of licensed chiropractors in Nevada is 685. The Board's growth of total active licensees went from 577 active licensees in 2013 to 685 active licensees at 2017 year end.



TEMPORARY LICENSURE

STATEMENT OF OBJECTIVE: The Board's objective regarding temporary licensure is to ensure out-of-state persons have valid credentials and are in good standing.

A person who holds a corresponding license or certificate in another jurisdiction and is in good standing and actively practices chiropractic in that jurisdiction may apply for a temporary license to treat patients in this State. A temporary license is valid for up to 10 days and a person may only be granted two temporary licenses per calendar year.

CHIROPRACTOR'S ASSISTANTS CERTIFICATIONS

STATEMENT OF OBJECTIVE: The Board's objective regarding certifications is to certify all qualified applicants promptly and courteously.

The Board certifies chiropractor's assistants once they have passed the Board's jurisprudence and chiropractor's assistant examination, which are currently administered by the Board twice per year. Prior to an applicant being eligible to take the exam they must fulfill 6-months of full time, on-the-job training (21 hours/week or more) or 12-months of part-time on-the-job training. Pursuant to NAC 634.130, chiropractor's assistants must renew their certificates biennially and 12 hours of continuing education must accompany their renewal.

The Board's certified Chiropractor's Assistants average 250 per year. The current active number of chiropractor's assistants is 261.

PRECEPTOR PROGRAM

STATEMENT OF OBJECTIVE: The Board's objective regarding its Preceptor Program is to provide on-the-job experience to students to safely serve the public.

The preceptor program is established to provide supervised clinical experience to students enrolled in colleges of chiropractic. The doctor and the student must submit an application accompanied by approval from the chiropractic college to the Board for approval to participate in the Preceptor Program. The Preceptor and the student must enter into an agreement prior to commencing the practice of chiropractic.

DISCIPLINARY PROCESS


STATEMENT OF OBJECTIVE: The Board's objective regarding its disciplinary process is to make the filing of a complaint by the public as simple as possible, to investigate every case thoroughly and in a timely manner, and to address all meritorious complaints openly and publicly.

A complaint against a Board's licensee or Chiropractor's Assistant is initiated through the receipt of a written complaint. The Board investigates every complaint. Complaints are received by the Executive Director and assigned to an Investigating Board Member by the President of the Board to conduct the investigation. Depending on the complexity of the case the Investigating Board Member may involve the board's counsel, or retained private investigators. When an investigation is completed, the Board determines at a public

meeting the outcome of each complaint based on a detailed complaint by the Investigating Board Member. The complaint includes a summary of the facts as determined by the investigation with all identifying information regarding the licensee at issue removed to assure the fairest, unbiased review of the information by the members of the Board.

If the Investigating Board Member determines that a case should proceed to a formal disciplinary action, the Board's staff prepares the formal documents for filing and service upon the licensee. Cases may be resolved through negotiations between the licensee and the Investigating Board Member. Some cases are serious, present novel issues, or cannot be resolved through negotiations, and those cases are heard at a formal disciplinary hearing presented to the full Board at a public meeting.

UNLICENSED ACTIVITY

STATEMENT OF OBJECTIVE: The Board's objective regarding unlicensed activity is to investigate and take appropriate action regarding the unlicensed activity.

NRS 634.018 & NRS 634.240 provide the Board's legal authority by which it may investigate, cite, and fine a person who practices chiropractic without a license. While there does not seem to be a strong presence of unlicensed activity, the Board does from time to time receive information of unlicensed activity.

ADMINISTRATIVE OBJECTIVES

STATEMENT OF OBJECTIVE: The Board' objectives regarding its administration are: (1) to assure that all of the Board's funds are wisely and effectively collected and spent to keep the costs to the Board's licensees to a minimum; (2) to assure that the public has useful and simple access to the Board's resources and processes; and (3) to continually improve the Board's operations and functions.

BOARD FUNDING - The Board receives no general fund money. Instead, the Board operates on fees collected from licensees and chiropractor's assistants. The Board's chiropractor's application fee is \$200.00, the Board's initial license fee is \$225.00, and the Board's fee for renewal of a biennial license is \$700.00. The Board also operates on the application fee of \$100.00 from chiropractor's assistants.

The Board has its books independently audited annually. None of the Board's independent audits have ever noted irregularities or problems with the Board's financial management practices. The Board provides copies of these audits to the Department of Administration and to the Legislative Counsel Bureau. Pursuant to the request of the Committee, attached is the 2017 audit and the most recent budgeting and accounting for the Board. (Tab 1. - Operating Budget 2015, 2016, and 2017); (Tab 2. - Income/Expense Reports for 2015, 2016, and 2017); (Tab 3. - FY 2016-2017 Audit).

PUBLIC ACCESSIBILITY – The Board attempts to make its processes and resources available to the public it serves. Recent initiatives to increase or assure public access include:

- Continual Website Improvement The Board knows that the public accesses its website regularly for information and assistance.
- Open Regulatory Process Though the Board does not promulgate many regulations, it has always made its regulatory process transparent and open to the public.

XIII. Itemized List of Services Offered By the Board

The Board prides itself on its responsiveness to the public, its applicants, and its licensees. The Board's telephone is answered by the Board's Licensing Specialist or the Executive Director, so questions of whatever nature are usually answered on-the-spot, thus saving the caller considerable time and frustration. XV. Statutory Tax Exemptions, Abatements, or Money Set Aside

- Pursuant to NRS 372.325, the Board is exempt from paying Nevada sales/use tax.
- Pursuant to §115 of the Internal Revenue Code, income of states and municipalities is not subject to federal income tax.
- According to the Internal Revenue Codes, gross income does not include: (1) income derived from any public utility or the exercise of any governmental function and accruing to a state or any political subdivision thereof, or the District of Columbia, or (2) income accruing to the government of any possession of the United States, or any political subdivision thereof.
- Pursuant to §1001 of the Internal Revenue Code, state and local governments are exempt from Social Security, except that beginning July 2, 1991, Social Security and Medicare HI coverage is mandatory for State and local government employees who meet the following conditions:
 - They are <u>not</u> members of a public retirement system; and
 - o They are not covered under a Section 218 agreement, unless excluded by law.

The Chiropractic Physicians' Board of Nevada is funded from fees collected from chiropractors and chiropractic assistants and does not receive funds from the State General Fund.

The Board believes that it meets its objectives in all respects. The Board licenses its new applicants efficiently. The Board investigates the consumer complaints it receives promptly, and is able to resolve most cases without the cost and disruption worked on the responding licensee and the Board from a disciplinary hearing.

XX. Recommendations for Statutory Changes

The Chiropractic Physician's Board anticipates submitting a BDR to propose revisions to NRS 634 to include omitting the language in NRS 634.080 and 634.090, which requires an applicant to submit their application to the Board 60 days before the date of the examination. The Board is in discussion of additional revisions.
