Oregon's Justice Reinvestment Program

Road to Justice Reinvestment:

Between 2000 and 2010, Oregon's prison rate increased by nearly 50% growing to 14,000 inmates with a total biennial corrections budget over \$1.4 billion and the need to build and open an additional prison facility by 2017.

After a few years of negotiation...



Justice Reinvestment Improve Public Corrections Fewer Crimes, Reinvestment Fewer Revocations Free-Up the Prison Financial Population Fewer Prison Beds

HB 3194 (2013) The Justice Reinvestment Act

HB 3194 stated goals:

Reduce recidivism
Reduce prison utilization
Increase public safety
Hold offenders accountable

Two Major components:

Justice Reinvestment Grant Program Some modest sentencing reductions


2013 – 15: \$15 million


Grant Funding:

2015 – 17: \$38.7 million


2017 – 19: \$40.1 million

\$7 million in supplemental funding for Prison Diversion








 Prison diversion programs: Enhanced local supervision, sanctions, and services


• Drug Courts









Male Prison Population and Forecasts






