Clark County School District And School Police - Growth

1989

- Department: 68 school police officers (2 officers at each high school, 1 officer at selected middle schools, patrol, and investigations)
- District: 120,000 students, 147 schools

Today

- Department: 171 school police officers (1 officer at each comprehensive high school, 1 officer at selected middle schools, patrol, investigations)
- District: 322,000 students, 358 schools



Current School-based Crime Statistics

- Assault and battery up 16.2% from last year
- Harassment and threats up 24% from last year
- Sex crimes up 10% from last year
- Narcotic related incidents up 15% from last year
- Firearms confiscated down 28% from last year





Specialized School-based Training

- Implicit Biased
- Crisis Intervention Team
- Drug Recognition Expert
- Gang Awareness
- Joint training with local agencies
- Computer Cell Phone Forensic
- Force Science





Active Assailant Training

- Approaching 20 years in training
- Techniques involve 1, 2, 3, and 4 team elements
- Firearm proficiency training involve active assailant techniques
- Joint training with local law enforcement agencies
- A full scale exercise conducted in May 2018, at one of our local high schools





CCSD Training & Drills

- Hard and soft lockdowns initiated in 2009
- The <u>L</u>ockdown, <u>I</u>ndependently Evacuate, <u>V</u>igilance, and <u>E</u>valuate Project added in 2016 as part of Crisis Response Planactive assailant training for teachers
- All employees receive yearly video training in lockdowns and evacuations
- In 2017, state required 3 hard lockdown and 2 soft lockdown drills each school year



Collaboration

- School Violence Initiative -2008
- One officer working with LMVPD through Community Action Team
- One officer working with Counter-Terrorism (SNCTC)
- One officer working with community partnerships focused on community relations





Community Action Team



- Joining forces approach to school safety
- Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department (NW Area Command) and CCSDPD desire expansion to all 10 area commands
- Mutual intelligence exchange street level
- Joint investigative and community engagement activities






SafeVoice



- Established by the Nevada Legislature in 2015 and the program went live in January 2018.
- Anonymous reporting system for threats to safety
- Although all CCSD schools are trained and able to receive tips through SafeVoice now; Performance Zones 1, 5, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 15 (160 schools) have marketed and communicated SafeVoice to their school communities
- From January through March, CCSDPD received 321 of the 1,568 CCSD tips and are estimated to receive 35 percent of an expected 12,000 tips for next school year.

Recommendations

- Law enforcement presence in middle schools
- Expanded jurisdiction: investigations, crime prevention programs, joint task forces
- School police included in School Resource Officer designation (SRO Defined, Nevada Law – Chapter 388 – 2017 Nevada Legislature AB 127)
