HWAD Mission Statement

Receive, store and issue conventional munitions; demilitarize and dispose of unserviceable, obsolete and surplus munitions; and maintain serviceability through inspection and renovation to ensure munitions readiness in support of Joint Forces.

HWAD Vision

To be JMC's premier demil and deep stow Depot providing timely and accurate storage, distribution, and demilitarization support to the enterprise, and COCOMs.

Accomplishments



Operation Patriot Bandoleer

- Retrograde of WRSA-K munitions
- Executed by NGB Soldiers w/Mil Assets
- Zero accidents; valuable training
- Cost savings vs. commercial assets

Demilitarization

- 20K Short Tons of munitions demilitarized
- 60% processed thru WADF w/R3 processes

Warfighter Training

- 1,100 personnel
- SOF Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine
- Conventional Air Force, USMC, Active Army, AR Reserve, NGB (NV, CA, AZ)

> Environmental Cleanup

7K acres of HWAD and BLM property cleared of Unexploded Ordnance (UXO)

Base Operating Contract

- Includes FAR Small Business Subcontracting Plan Requirement
- Government Contracting Personnel Review and Enforce Compliance

> Defense Environmental Restoration Program

- Addresses Legacy Contamination
- Executed under NAICS 562910 Remediation Services
- Utilize SBs to maximum extent 9 of 12 contracts awarded to SBs
- \$66 million dollars awarded since 2010
- \$90 million planned thru 2025
- All categories except HBCU's Women, Minority, Native American, Service-Disabled Veteran, and HUB



ARMS Program



- > What Is It?
 - Congressionally-mandated defense conversion/commercial reuse program

Goals:

- Reduce Government (taxpayer) ownership costs
- Maintain readiness capability
- Reduce the impact of defense downsizing on local communities

Mandates:

- Increase opportunities for SBs including the socially/economically disadvantaged
- Create commercial jobs which retain critical skills needed for the HWAD mission
- Foster the relocation of offshore production ventures
- Create sustainable economic opportunities
- Join available federal, state, and local Government resources with those of the private sector to achieve program goals
- Support, encourage, and execute the generation of new sustainable start up businesses and the creation of substantial jobs
- Develop and execute land uses supportive of ARMS and the local community

- Supporting construction of additional facilities

- ∼5,000 personnel planned in CY18
- Potential Special Operations Certification & Capstone Training Event
- Army War College Simulation Center


