Payment Plan Fees, Collection Fees, Warrant Fees Convenience Fees

- b. The purpose for which the fee is imposed:
  - a. Payment Plan Fees are imposed when defendant placed on payment plan
  - b. Collection Fees are imposed to recover the cost of collection efforts
  - c. Warrant Fees are imposed for failure to appear or pay
  - d. Convenience Fees are imposed for online payments made by debit or credit card to recover the costs imposed by the bank and payment processor

- c. The amount of the fee:
  - a. Payment Plan Fees are \$25
  - b. Collection Fees are \$100, however NRS 176.064 allows up to 10% of the amount of the delinquency
  - c. Warrant Fees are \$178
  - d. Convenience Fees are 2.2% of the payment amount
- d. The legal authority for imposing the fee:
  - a. Collection Fees are authorized under NRS 176.064
  - b. Warrant Fees are authorized per Blackjack Bonding v. Las Vegas Municipal Court, 116 Nev. 1213 (2000) which established that the Nevada Constitution grants the Courts of the State of Nevada the inherent power to charge and collect reasonable fees related to specific purposes.
  - c. Convenience Fees are authorized under NRS 1.113 and NRS 354.770
- e. A breakdown of the amount of revenue collected for each type of fee:
  - a. FY 2016
    - i. Payment Plan Fees \$10,335.00
    - ii. Collection Fees \$81,125.00
    - iii. Warrant Fees \$145,638.00
    - iv. Convenience Fees \$12,747.34

  - i. Payment Plan Fees \$13,422.00
  - ii. Collection Fees \$74.128.47
  - iii. Warrant Fees \$131,967.00

Bail forfeitures for traffic misdemeanors are remitted to the Clark County General Fund.

- NO at present time Henderson Justice Court does not utilized an outside collection agency. However, County Courts have a contract with Valley Collection Services.

The court does not distinguish between failure to appear and failure to pay for tracking warrants. Approximately 1400 traffic citations enter warrant status each year.
