We are pleased to announce that there are four scholarship opportunities available for Nevada Youth Legislature (NYL) graduating members and alumni who successfully completed at least one year of the two-year NYL term:

- 1. The Senator Valerie Wiener NYL Scholarship (one \$1,000 scholarship);
- 2. The Nevada Youth Legislature Scholarship (one \$1,000 scholarship);
- 3. The Senator Joyce Woodhouse NYL Scholarship (one \$500 scholarship); and
- 4. The Former Youth Legislator Jon (and Tara) Oglesby NYL Scholarship (one \$500 scholarship).

Scholarships are to be used for tuition, class materials, or campus-related fees. Scholarships will be paid directly to an accredited institution of higher learning for undergraduate or graduate study.

THE SELECTION PROCESS

Applicants will be evaluated based on the following criteria:

- Academic performance;
- Demonstrated leadership through scholastic and civic engagement activities, including service in the NYL and beyond; and
- Essay responses.

APPLICATION DEADLINE

Applications must be received or postmarked on or before April 30, 2021. At this time, our intention is to determine 2021 scholarship recipients by June 1, 2021.
