NEVADA PAROLE AND PROBATION STATUTORY DUTIES

NRS Chapters 176, 176A, 209, & 213; NAC 213:

Descriptions of responsibilities –

- Conducting pre-sentence investigations and making sentencing recommendations to the District Courts of Nevada (until 6/30/2020)
- Monitoring and enforcing offender compliance with conditions of their community supervision while on parole, probation or as an inmate on residential confinement
- Collecting restitution payments and disbursing monies received to victims of crime



NEVADA PAROLE AND PROBATION STATUTORY DUTIES

Descriptions of responsibilities continued –

- Reporting behavioral misconduct and supervision violations to the District Courts of Nevada and the Parole Board
- Conducting pre-parole, conditional release and incoming Interstate Compact investigations to ensure appropriate community placement and supervision for offenders
- Assisting offenders in successfully reintegrating into society
- Conducting pardon investigations and making recommendations to the Pardons Board

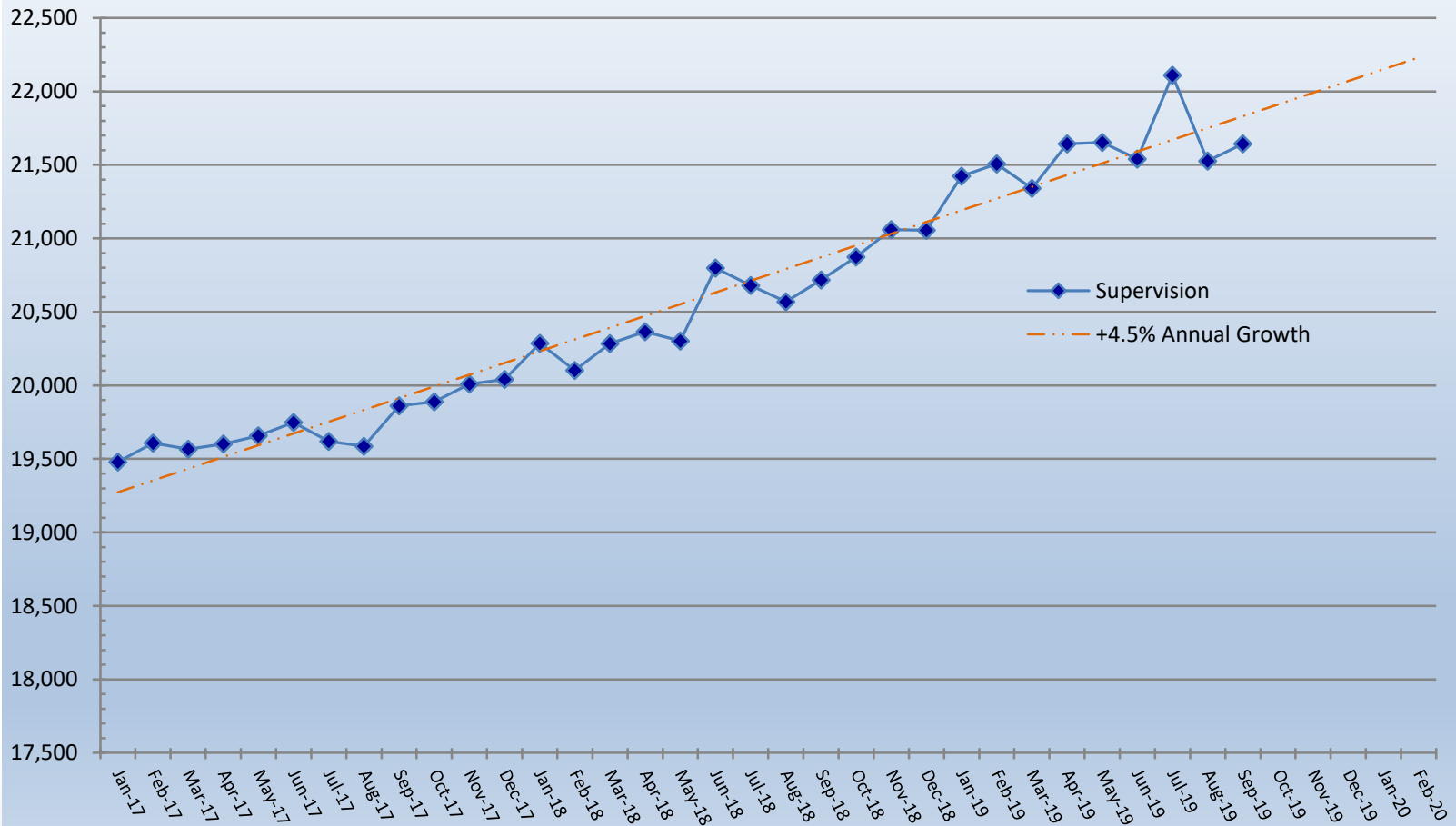

(Parole, Probation, Lifetime, Inmates on Res Con, Pre-release, Warrant)

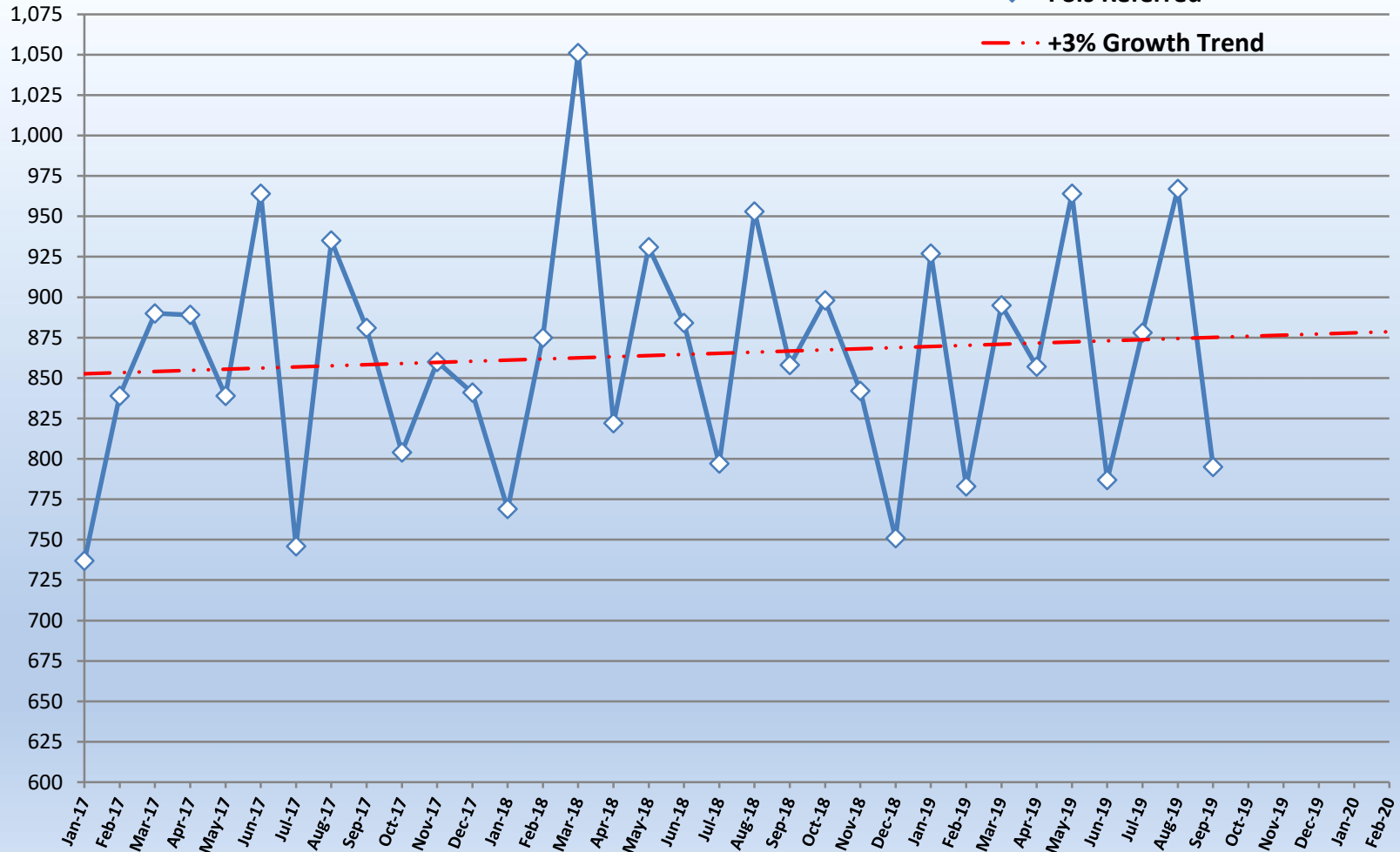




NEVADA PAROLE AND PROBATION PRE-SENTENCE REFERRALS

NEVADA PAROLE AND PROBATION IMPACT OF LEGISLATION

- **Assembly Bill 8**

- Risk assessments were required every 6 months. Now required in accordance with current assessment tool

- **Senate Bill 8**

- Added requirements to NRS 213.1243 (Lifetime Supervision)

- **Senate Joint Resolution 1 (to voters in 2020)**

- Doubles annual Pardons hearings

- **Nevada Question 1 (2018) – Marsy’s Law**

- Amends Nevada Constitution to include several victim rights including restitution being paid before any other legal fees



NEVADA PAROLE AND PROBATION IMPACT OF LEGISLATION

- **Assembly Bill 236 – Effective July 2020**
 - **Added, modified, and deleted multiple criminal justice statutes**
 - §6 requires NPP to collect and report certain metrics
 - §13 deletes PSI content recommendation requirements
 - §18 and §33 added graduated sanctions
 - §19, 22, 23 added substance abuse program requirements
 - §24 deleted exceptions to mandatory probation for Category E felonies



NEVADA PAROLE AND PROBATION IMPACT OF LEGISLATION

- **Assembly Bill 236 continued**
 - **Added, modified, and deleted multiple criminal justice statutes**
 - **§34** changed probation term lengths
 - **§35 and §101** added revocation conditions and temporary revocations for technical probation/parole violations
 - **§93.7** added early parole discharge petition requirements
 - **§95** added parole risk/needs assessment requirements
 - **§105** added behavioral health training requirements



NEVADA PAROLE AND PROBATION STAFFING / BUDGETARY CHALLENGES

- **The Division has a total of 600 positions**
 - Overall vacancy rate of 11.3% or 68 vacant positions
 - The Division will have a total of 603 positions as of July 1, 2020
- **332 Sworn Positions**
 - 37 Sworn Vacancies (11.1%)
- **268 Non-Sworn Positions**
 - 31 Non-Sworn Vacancies (11.5%)

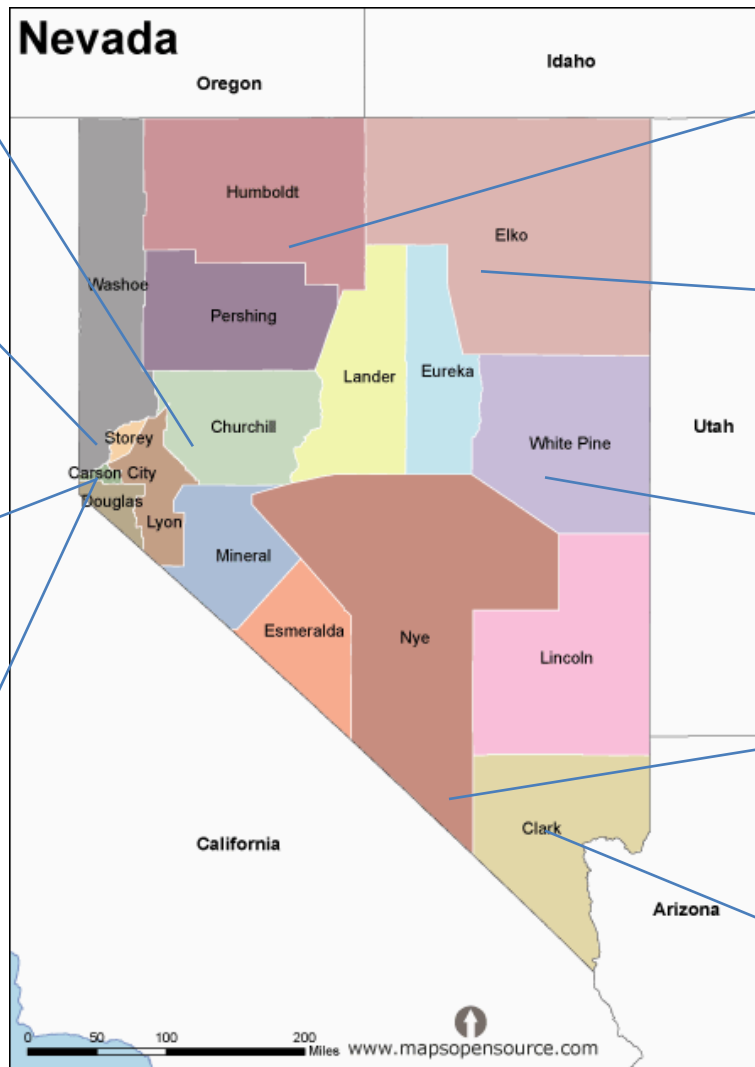
