

Governor Guinn Millennium Scholarship Program Updates for Legislative Committee on Education

The Governor Guinn Millennium Scholarship (GGMS) is a statewide merit-based program established by the Nevada Legislature in 1999. Initial eligibility for the program is based on high school performance, including GPA or test scores and completion of a core curriculum. Once in college students must meet continuing eligibility requirements. 2019 Legislative Session – Senate Bill 453

- Effective July 1, 2020 (Chapter 290, Statutes of Nevada 2019)
- NSHE Campuses will be communicating with currently enrolled GGMS students this spring to notify them of the upcoming change
- To remain eligible for the scholarship all students must earn a 2.75 GPA for each semester GGMS funding is received
 - This single GPA for continuing eligibility replaces a tiered approach whereby students in their first year were required to maintain a 2.6 semester GPA and a 2.75 semester GPA thereafter
