# The Impacts Affect the Entire Community



#### Need for Consistency

Dramatic inconsistencies in the early court appearance process between:

- Different counties within Nevada;
- Different courts within the same county; and
- Different judges within the same court.

- 1. Recategorize non-aggravated traffic offenses as citations, not punishable by jail time.
- 2. Mandatory citation in lieu of arrest for certain misdemeanor crimes.
- 3. **Presumption of release** for arrestees.

- 4. Conditions of release must be the <u>least restrictive conditions</u> necessary to *reasonably* prevent imminent threat of serious bodily harm and *reasonably* ensure return to court, based on <u>individualized</u> determination in each case.
- Need to ensure that we don't convert from an incarceration state to a supervision state.
- 5. **Burden on the State** to seek preventive detention where appropriate.

- 6. Hearing to take place ideally 12-24 hours after arrest, or within 48 hours of arrest at the most, for anyone for which the State seeks preventive detention, with due process protections for the accused:
- A. Assistance of counsel;
- B. Right to present evidence;
- C. Right to cross-examine witnesses;

- 6. Hearing to take place ideally 12-24 hours after arrest, or within 48 hours of arrest at the most, for anyone for which the State seeks preventive detention, with due process protections for the accused (Con't):
- D. State must establish by clear and convincing evidence that preventive detention is the least restrictive condition that will reasonably prevent imminent threat of serious bodily harm and reasonably ensure return to court;
- E. Court must make specific factual findings on the record to justify preventive detention.

7. 48-hour grace period after a missed court date to give a defendant an opportunity to reschedule without a warrant being issued.
