Totaling approx. **160,000** acres



129 permanent &145 seasonal staff



- **280,000+** visitors in 2019
- Highest concentration of State Parks in NV (6 parks)
- In 1925, Cathedral Gorge
 was set aside as "State
 Recreational Grounds,"
 arguably making it the first
 Nevada State Park
- 3 of the first 4 official NV State Parks were in Lincoln County

ECONOMIC IMPACT

- \$160 million in visitor spending per year
 - Fuel, lodging, food, gear, etc.
- Out-of-state and overseas visitors nearly 50%
- Concessions and Commercial Use Permits
 - Kayak rentals, Spring Mountain Ranch Super Summer Theater, Shakespeare at Sand Harbor, X-Terra Race at Spooner, nearly 1,000 weddings in 2019 at State Parks
- Partnerships with County tourism offices and sporting goods retailers
 - Bike races, fishing derbies, Fire & Ice

- Epic mountain biking destination
- More than 40 miles of single track mountain bike trails under construction in Lincoln County's high desert
- 12 miles of trail complete at Kershaw-Ryan State Park
- Area's terrain & beauty create unmatched mountain biking experiences
- Grand Opening of connected trail system – fall 2020

WALKER RIVER STATE RECREATION AREA

- 28 miles of pristine river corridor is now open to the public for outdoor adventures
- Includes the Pitchfork Ranch, Rafter 7 Ranch, Flying M Ranch, and Nine Mile Ranch
- Offers fishing, hunting, off-road exploration, camping, nature trails, interpretive displays, and visitor center
 - Coming soon! Rustic and remote cabins for that popular "glamping" experience
 - Opportunity to incorporate OHV facilities
 - Official "Water Trail" established on the East Walker River, includes kayak/canoe put-ins & take-outs



WALKER RIVER STATE RECREATION AREA

Rafter 7 Ranch

- Upgraded water system to meet code
- Currently purchasing 2 cabins



Flying M Ranch

- Assumed operation and management of Flying M Ranch on February 1, 2020
- Assessing staffing and budget needs, deferred maintenance, converting to public water system, interpretative programing/oral history

ICE AGE FOSSILS STATE PARK

315-acre park features a portion of the Las Vegas wash that is rich in paleontological and historic resources

- Parking lot is complete, utilities are in place
- February 2020: New Visitors Center broke ground
- September 2020: Estimated completion date

SPOONER LAKE - LAKE TAHOE NEVADA STATE PARK

Project designed to carry out a component of the SR 28 Master Plan

- Next phase of East Shore Trail will connect Sand Harbor to Spooner
- Phase I development: new visitors center and amphitheater – construction expected to begin spring 2020
- Phase II improvements: reconfigured parking, group use areas, redesigned maintenance facilities (currently unfunded)

Spooner Lake – SR 28 Corridor Master Plan

- SR 28 is a 10-mile stretch along East Shore of Tahoe one of Nevada's most congested recreation corridors
- Master Plan envisions environmental, public safety, and recreation improvements, including:
 - Bike paths and parking areas
 - Underground utilities
 - Forest health improvements
 - Facility improvements
- Partnership among private, state, local, federal agencies

New Amenities

WiFi access added to numerous state parks

- Self pay stations 19 new stations coming soon
- Additional full hook-up RV sites:
 - 29 at Washoe Lake
 - 25 at South Fork
 - 23 at Spring Valley
 - 15 at Kershaw-Ryan
- Rental cabins:
 - 3 cabins can be rented at Wild Horse
 - 4 cabins planned for Pitchfork
 - 2 cabins planned for Rafter 7

Partnerships:

Grant Opportunities:

- Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF)
- Recreational Trails Program (RTP)
- Federal Lands Access Program (FLAP)
- Lake Tahoe License Plate Program (LTLPP)

Bond Sales:

- Conservation Bonds (Q1)
- Environmental Improvement Program (EIP)
- Capital Improvement Planning (CIP)

Future project feasibility will be heavily impacted by bond sales connected to the Conservation and Resource Protection Grant Program, as well as CIP consideration
