PAROLE AND PROBATION

- Repeal Inquiry Hearing in NRS 176A.580 thru 176A.610
- Changes to the definition of 'technical violation':
 - *Exclude a failure of inpatient treatment from the definition*
 - *Firearms*
 - *Violations by sexual offenders*
- More flexibility for judges
- Add to list of offenses not eligible for early termination or reduced probation terms:
 - *Residential Burglary and Home Invasion*
 - *Discharging into/from a Structure/Vehicle*
 - *Possession of Firearm by a Prohibited Person*
 - *CCW*
- Defendants who want to be revoked

DIVERSION

- Clarity and congruence
- Add Elder Abuse/Exploitation to the list of excluded offenses

CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES

- PCSWITS remains a Category D felony
- “3363 treatment” eligibility extends to those who possess up to 100 grams

MARIJUANA

- Penalties for Marijuana
 - Under an Ounce
 - Legal
 - 28.3495 grams to 42 grams
 - Category B felony, 1-10
 - 42 grams to 100 grams
 - Category B felony, 2-15
 - 100 grams to 50 pounds
 - 50 pounds + is marijuana trafficking
 - Starting at a Category C felony, 1-5
- Similar issue for THC/Concentrated Cannabis
