It is my understanding that under current law, public employees who have a CCW and are not prohibited from carrying a firearm at work, are allowed to do so.

I have just learned that there is to be a vote on a new regulation that would require a public employee who is carrying at work, to notify the appointing authority or designee, that they will be carrying a firearm, or face disciplinary action.

This is a drastic change from current practice and will have an impact on public employees across the state. This appears to be nothing more than a harassment mechanism of persons lawfully exercising their rights under both Nevada Law and the US Constitution.

Please inform the committee that I am NOT in favor of restricting rights of lawful citizens who happen to be public employees. Providing notice that an employee is lawfully exercising their rights is unnecessary.

VOTE AGAINST THIS PROPOSAL that will only serve to infringe on personal freedoms and will not improve safety.
