The Legislative Commission's Subcommittee to Review the U.S. Department of Labor's Report on the Nevada Occupational Safety and Health Program (*Nevada Revised Statutes* 218E.200) will convene its first meeting in Las Vegas on Friday, April 23, 2010, at 9:30 a.m., in Room 4401 of the Grant Sawyer State Office Building. The meeting will also be videoconferenced to Room 2135 of the Legislative Building in Carson City, and public comment at the end of the meeting will be welcome from both locations.
