WestCare has operated the Community Triage Center (CTC) in Las Vegas since 2003 and a similar albeit smaller Community Triage Center in Reno, Nevada in 2007. The Centers provide triage services for persons with mental health issues as well as safe, medically supervised detoxification services. The Triage Centers offer safe and effective treatment options for early intervention for both populations. The program's philosophy is that successful treatment can be accomplished in a supportive environment helped along by nurses, EMTs, substance abuse counselors, psychiatrists and case managers.

The goal of the Community Triage Center (CTC) is to help relieve local healthcare, social service and law enforcement systems burdened by an overwhelming number of people suffering from mental health and substance abuse disorders. The CTC provides an access point for people in crisis that can be used by individuals, hospitals and law enforcement agencies. Referral and access to the CTC are accomplished through a variety of means, including the following:

- Law Enforcement Law enforcement officers can drop individuals as needed, diverting them from clogged detention centers and local jails.
- Paramedics Local private ambulance services can drop appropriate individuals, diverting them from local emergency rooms.
- Fire Department Emergency Medical Services workers can divert individuals in crisis from local emergency rooms.
- Hospitals WestCare will provide transportation from area hospitals to the CTC, alleviating crowded emergency rooms.
- Individuals Individuals in crisis can self-refer to access services.

The CTC staff, including nursing and therapeutic staff who are onsite 24 hours a day, triage the individual's medical condition, mental status, substance abuse and social service needs. They assess individuals to insure that they are appropriate to receive services at the CTC. Individuals with continuing medical problems are given appropriate

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treatments and/or referrals to higher levels of medical care. Those with substance abuse addiction are closely monitored throughout the detoxification process. Substance abuse and mental health professionals evaluate individuals for continued treatment and make referrals to other WestCare services or to other appropriate community resources. Individuals with mental health problems are evaluated and treated both medically and mentally as indicated. For those in need of further services, medications, prescriptions and referrals are given. Dually diagnosed individuals are referred to WestCare substance abuse services with a mental health co-occurring treatment plan. Transportation is provided to individuals needing service at the CTC by trained teams of drivers. Individuals are transported between WestCare facilities and other community referrals.
