

Child victims of abuse and neglect, rate per 100,000



Juvenile arrests per 100,000, 2008





Exports to top 10 destinations, \$ mil





Per capita energy consumption, mil. BTU, 2007



Energy consumption per \$ of real GDP, ths BTUs, 2007








Violent crime rates per capita, 2007, U.S.=100

Property crime rates per capita, 2007, U.S.=100






% of commuters
