 - State with the fastest growing senior population
- Washoe County and the "Baby Boom"
 - 4% annual growth
- Business opportunity and a public service challenge
- Civic Engagement seniors will continue to contribute to their community
- Escalating Cost of Long-Term Care
 - State and County risk
 - No federal long-term care policy
- N4A "Blueprint for an Aging Society"
 - Determine "aging readiness" policies, programs, services
 - Ensure communities are "livable" for persons of all ages
 - Harness the talent, wisdom, experience of older adults

Senior Services today

- 1,000 people per day/5,000 per year at 8 sites, including 4 senior centers
 - Classes and activities, congregate meals 3,500 people per year
 - Older Americans Month; 60+ events on 25 days
- In-home services
 - Home delivered meals, homemaker ~700 people per year
- Alternatives to nursing home care
 - DayBreak capacity 33 people, 70 people per year
- Access to services
 - Aging and Disability Resource Center 3,000 people per year
 - Case management and social work 500 people per year
 - Senior Law Project 1,000 people per year
- Partnerships
 - Preventing institutionalization
 - Library
 - Volunteers and volunteer organizations
 - Northern Nevada Food Bank


Housing

 - Integrate Adult Services and Senior Services County Department services
 - Seamless customer service
 - Single point of entry
 - Continuum of care
 - Veteran Services Officer
- Master Plan to select sites for senior and community centers

Policies

- County policies support "Lifelong Community" and "aging-inplace"
- Support Civic Engagement
 - Appointing seniors to decision-making Boards and Advisory Boards
 - Support volunteer programs
- Community-wide strategies
 - Convene the Community
 - Opportunities for business, non-profits, churches and congregations, neighborhoods, schools to build "Lifelong Community" and aging-in-place strategies
 - A Senior "scorecard"
 - Quality of life and outcome measures include seniors
 - Collaborations with City of Reno, City of Sparks







- Program actions
 - Guidelines for each County Department to develop an "age readiness" plan
 - Policies, programs, customer service, employees
 - E.g., Court procedures that give <u>all</u> victims, witnesses and jurors access to information and court facilities
 - Feasibility study to integrate Adult Services and Senior Services
 - A master plan for service center site selection
 - Co-locate agencies that are inclusive of all ages.
 - Feasibility of a County Veteran Services Office
