The District Attorney Victim Witness Assistance Center was created to assist victims and witnesses through the criminal prosecution system.

When a case is filed with the District Attorney's Office, a letter is generated to all victims/witnesses on the witness list from the police report. That letter tells you that a Victim Advocate has been assigned to that case and that you can get further information by calling (702) 671-2525. A booklet is also included with the letter which explains the criminal prosecution system and the steps involved.

The District Attorney's Office hopes that you never need to contact us, but should you become a victim or witness to a crime and receive one of our letters which begins "A criminal case was recently filed" then you should call us for further information and assistance. Our Advocates are assigned to each case which is being prosecuted. We are located at 200 Lewis Ave., Ste. 3345 in the Regional Justice Center.

We are able to provide the following resources and assistance; Case information; court escorts; taxis/transportation to court when necessary; restitution paperwork; Victims of Crime applications; witness fees for court appearances; referrals to social services and support groups such as STOP DUI, or when needed, counseling groups as well as property returns when the case has been completed.
