

## What is Nevada Health Center, Inc.?

- Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) Programs are funded under Section 330 of the Public Health Service Act. NVHC was one of the first rural federally funded Community Health Centers in 1977.
- NVHC is a private, not for profit 501(c)(3) Corporation.
- NVHC is governed by a 15 member policymaking Board of Directors. The board members consist of representatives from communities served.





## Nevada Health Center, Inc. Patients






### **Rural Patient Payor Source**

## Rural Nevada Health Care Challenges

- Increasing Costs (salaries, supplies, etc)
  - Provider Salaries increased 30%+ in the last 24 months.
- Decreasing Number of Primary Care Providers willing to work in rural and frontier areas
  - Eureka over a year without a permanent doctor
  - Wendover starting in June 2006 without a permanent doctor
  - Jackpot starting in July 2006 without a permanent doctor
- OB/GYN services in Elko
  - No services available to patients unable to pay
  - NVHC provides prenatal services but no referral options except to ID, UT, and Reno
