Community Outreach 2002 - 2005

Fall 2002 – DS I

- 1,586 elementary school students were seen for oral hygiene and nutrition instructions
- 1,664 elementary school students were seen for dental screenings with the State of Nevada Health Division

Spring 2003 – DS I

- 1,816 elementary school students were seen for oral hygiene
- 135 elementary school students seen for Nutrition Instruction

Fall 2003 – DS II

- 508 senior residents at 20 Assisted Living Centers were seen for oral health education
- 50 UNLV resident students of Tonopah Hall were screened for oral disease
- 40 caretakers of Alzheimer patients were instructed on oral hygiene
- 25 parents participated in the Buddy Walk for children with Downs Syndrome and received oral hygiene instructions.

Spring 2004 – DS I

- 68 elementary schools are scheduled to participate in sealant program
- 4028 elementary school students in Clark County School District are scheduled to receive oral health education
- 25 UNLV pre-schoolers given Oral Hygiene instructions by members of the Student National Dental Association (SNDA)
- 50 children treated during “Give Kids a Smile” CCSN – National Children’s Dental Health Month
- 100 participants received oral health instructions at Health Expo 2004
- 25 participants were screened for oral health at Health Expo 2004

- 25 residents at an Assisted Living Center for senior residents were seen for oral health education
- 25 UNLV pre-schoolers given Oral Hygiene instructions by members of the Student National Dental Association (SNDA)
- 50 children treated during “Give Kids a Smile” CCSN – National Children’s Dental Health Month
- 100 participants received oral health instructions at Health Expo 2004
- 25 participants were screened for oral health at Health Expo 2004

Spring 2004 – Dr. Sandoval

- 50 parents in attendance: “Prevention of Oral Disease” - Parents Club of Rose Warren Elementary School.

Fall 2004 – DS II

- 23 students of Elizondo elementary were instructed in oral hygiene.
- 444 senior residents at 20 Assisted Living Centers were seen for oral health education.
- 40 caretakers of Alzheimer patients were instructed on oral hygiene
- 42 homeless were seen for oral health education at Salvation Army Pathways program

DS III

- 144 children and 72 adults were instructed on oral hygiene for the Downs Syndrome Foundation “Buddy Walk”.

Spring 2005 – DS I

- 2489 elementary school students within the CCSD were seen for oral hygiene and nutrition instructions during the month of February.
- 3424 elementary school students within the CCSD were seen for oral hygiene and nutrition instructions during the month of April.

- 50 students at Manniou Middle School received oral hygiene instructions.

Summer 2005

DS I, II, and III

- 27 children and adults received oral health screenings during Special Olympics.

DS I, II and DS III

- 350 children at Reynaldo Martinez Elementary School were given oral screening examinations and 250 children were given fluoride varnish treatments.

Fall 2005

DS II

- 40 elementary school children participated in organizing packets of toothbrushes and paste to aid the children affected by hurricane Katrina.

DS III

- 45 students at Aggie Roberts elementary school received oral hygiene instructions

DS IV

- 125 children and 74 adults were instructed on oral hygiene for the Downs Syndrome Foundation “Buddy Walk”

Fall 2005- Dr. Mildred McClain

- 40 College of Nursing students received oral hygiene instructions.
- 25 middle and senior high students received oral hygiene instructions through Nevada Business Services, “Project You” program.
- 125 adults received oral health care instructions at the Mohave Mental Health Fair in conjunction with UNLV main campus.

Fall 2005

DS I, II and III

- 75 pediatric patients received dental care at UNLV School of Dental Medicine during “First Saturday” sponsored by Southern Nevada Dental Association in partnership with CCOH.
- 60 children and 105 adults were given oral health care instructions at the Moapa Paiute Health Services – Moapa Indian Reservation.
- 1,151 elementary school children were screened by the Colgate Bright Smiles Bright Futures Van in partnership with the School of Dental Medicine
- 106 seniors citizens were screened for oral cancer at the ‘East Las Vegas Senior Health Fair’
