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Tribe's Unite in Victim Awareness Event scheduled for Monday, April 24, 2006

The Walker River Paiute Tribe and the Fallon Paiute-Shoshone Tribe is coordinating an event titled, **"Tribe's United in Victim Awareness"**. The focus is on victims of Child Abuse, Domestic Violence, and Elder Abuse. This is a very ambitious event that requires both organizations and community support. All the Nevada Tribes and other organizations will be invited to participate in this event on Monday, April 24, 2006.

The week of April 23-29, 2006, is a National Crime Victims' Rights Week. This is a time honored commemoration designed to increase public awareness of and knowledge among crime victims and survivors about the wide range of rights and services available to people who have been victimized by crime.

The Fallon Paiute-Shoshone Tribe, Children's Justice Act has received funding from the Office for Victims of Crime (OVC), within the Office of Justice Programs, U.S. Department of Justice, to promote community awareness and crime victim outreach activities in conjunction with the National Crime Victims' Rights Week. The grant award is for \$5,000.

The Tribe's have decided to commemorate the National Crime Victim's Rights Week by hosting a walk commencing on two reservations and having the groups walk toward each other and meeting in the middle. One group will start in Schurz at 8:00 a.m. at the tribe's park on the Walker River Paiute Indian Reservation, walking toward Fallon. The tribal group will start gathering around 7:00 a.m. and will begin their walk precisely at 8:00 a.m. The other group will meet at the Fallon Paiute-Shoshone Tribe's Fox Peak and walk towards Schurz. The walk from Fox Peak will begin at 8:30 a.m.

after the school traffic has subsided. Both groups will meet in the middle at the Allen Hot Springs site on the east side of Highway 95 at Churchill mile marker 7. Each group will walk 20 miles. Don't worry no individual will walk the entire 20 miles. There will be escort vehicles provided to insure the safety and well-being of every participant. Each individual may walk or run at his/her own pace, and may rest in vehicles as needed. The object is to have people walking at all times.

At the Allen Hot Springs, a Memorandum of Agreement addressing the issues of victimization will be executed between the Walker River Paiute Tribe and the Fallon Paiute-Shoshone Tribe and any other Tribes/organizations who send a formal representative.

There will be a free lunch provided for all participants. Upon registration, free raffle tickets will be provided to all participants for a chance to win various prizes. There is no cost to participate. Special prizes will be given to the oldest and youngest male and female who participate in the walk. There will be a limited amount of tee-shirts/water bottles provided to the first 200 participants who show up and register for the walk. Pre-registrations will be taken in advance; however, to receive the tee-shirts and water bottles, a participant must personally appear and sign in at the starting site. Other special categories for prizes are being considered.
