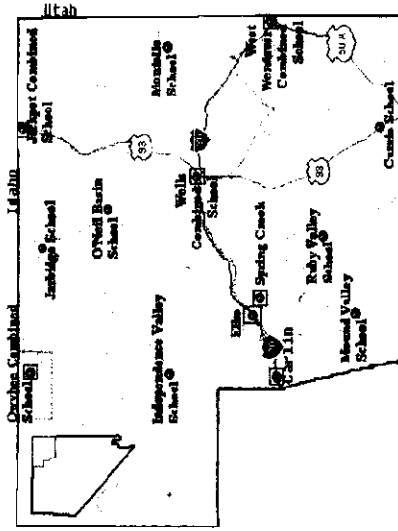

The Elko County School District is located in the northeastern corner of Nevada. The District covers 17,146 square miles and has schools located in seven communities throughout the county.

Owyhee Combined School has 273 students in grades K-12 and is located on the Duck Valley Indian Reservation which lies on the Nevada-Idaho border 140 miles south of Boise, Idaho. Jackpot Combined School houses 266 students in grades K-12 and is located in Jackpot, which lies on the Idaho border 47 miles south of Twin Falls, Idaho. The community of Wells, located 50 miles east of Elko, has an elementary school and a secondary school which serve a total of 375 students. Wendover Schools are located at West Wendover, Nevada which lies on the Nevada-Utah border 120 miles west of Salt Lake City, Utah. Wendover Elementary School houses 714 students and Wendover Junior/Senior High School has an enrollment of 433 students. Carlin Combined School, located in Carlin, Nevada, 23 miles west of Elko, houses 461 students in grades K-12. Sage Elementary is located 7 miles southeast of Elko and houses 494 students in grades K-5. The Spring Creek Elementary School is located 14 miles southeast of Elko and serves students from several residential developments and rural communities.

At the present time, this school houses 645 students in grades K-5. The Spring Creek High School is located 7 miles southeast of Elko and houses 856 students in grades 9-12. Spring Creek Middle School is located 7 miles southeast of Elko and houses 688 students in grades 6-8.

The largest community in Elko County is Elko. The estimated population at this time is approximately 25,000. Elko has the following schools: Elko High School serving grades 9-12 with 1,217 students; Elko Junior High School serving grades 7 and 8 with 735 students; Southside Elementary serving grades K-6 with 666 students; Northside Elementary serving grades K-6, with 561 students; Mountain View Elementary serving grades K-6, with 689 students, and Grammar School #2 serving grades K-6 with 414 students.
