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## INTRODUCTION

This interim committee brief provides background information and summarizes major issues related to the Joint Interim Standing Committee on Judiciary. It includes information on the Committee's jurisdiction, membership, and schedule; anticipated topics for this interim, and relevant audits, reports, and studies.

The wide-ranging jurisdiction of the Committee includes cannabis, civil procedure, corrections, crimes and punishments, domestic relations, gaming, guardianships, human trafficking, property rights, summary evictions, and wills and estates. This jurisdiction generally comprises Titles 1 through 7, 9, 11 through 16, and 41 of *Nevada Revised Statutes* (NRS) and Chapters 1, 2 through 7, 101 through 104A, 111 through 117, 119A, 120, 120A, 453A, 453D, 475, 719, and 721 of NRS, except measures affecting primarily state and local revenue.

## ASSEMBLY BILL 443

[Assembly Bill 443](#) (2021) created the Joint Interim Standing Committee on Judiciary. Assembly Bill 443 (2021) specifically requires the Committee to evaluate and review issues relating to juvenile justice previously addressed by the Legislative Committee on Child Welfare and Juvenile Justice as well as certain issues related to Nevada’s Department of Corrections (NDOC) and the Department of Public Safety (DPS) that were previously overseen by the Advisory Commission on the Administration of Justice (ACAJ). The bill also repealed the Committee on Industrial Programs and assigned its duties to the Committee. The Committee may request up to 15 bill drafts requests, five of which must relate to matters relating to juvenile justice.

## MANDATED ACTIVITIES

In addition to duties outlined in AB 443 (2021), two bills were passed during the 2021 Legislative Session that require the committee to evaluate and review issues relating to sex offender registration and sexual assault.

[Senate Bill 161](#)—Abolishes the Advisory Committee to Study Laws Concerning Sex Offender Registration and transfers the Committee’s duties to the ACAJ.

[Assembly Bill 214](#)—Requires the ACAJ to appoint a subcommittee to conduct an interim study concerning sexual assault. The study and report must include, without limitation, an evaluation of:

1. The laws governing sexual assault in this state;
2. The laws governing sexual assault in other states and territories of the United States;
3. Any other matter that the ACAJ determines is relevant to the study; and
4. Recommendations and input from attorneys, victims, and any other stakeholders concerning necessary changes to the laws governing sexual assault in this state.

The subcommittee shall submit a report of the results of the study and any recommendations for legislation to the ACAJ not later than September 1, 2022.

## PRIORITY ISSUES OF STUDY

In conjunction with studying the issues outlined above, the Committee will focus its time and attention primarily on issues related to:

- Corrections;
- Juvenile justice;
- Human trafficking;
- Summary eviction;
- Sex offender registration – [Senate Bill 161](#) (2021) (Advisory Committee to Study Laws Concerning Sex Offender Registration, previously required to report to the ACAJ);
- Sexual assault – [Assembly Bill 214](#) (2021) (Interim study on sexual assault previously to be conducted by the ACAJ); and
- Implementation of previous legislation – [Assembly Bill 116](#) (2021) (decriminalization of traffic offenses) and [Assembly Bill 236](#) (2019) (broad criminal justice reform).

The Committee may pursue any other matters in its jurisdiction as needed based on current events.

## RELEVANT REPORTS

A variety of reports and audits are available regarding judiciary issues in Nevada, including reports produced by legislative committees, the Nevada Judiciary, executive branch agencies, and the Research and Audit Divisions of the LCB.

### LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEES—2019–2020 INTERIM COMMITTEE BULLETINS

During the 2021 Legislative Session, the Legislative Committee on Child Welfare and Juvenile Justice was abolished, and its duties and responsibilities were transferred to the Joint Interim Standing Committee on Judiciary. Also, the ACAJ was repealed, and its duties and responsibilities were transferred to the Committee. The following are summaries of the Committee’s legislative bulletins from the 2019-2020 Interim:

#### [Advisory Commission on the Administration of Justice](#)

[The Advisory Commission on the Administration of Justice](#) was required to identify and study various aspects of the state’s criminal justice system and, prior to the next regular session of the Legislature, must prepare and submit to the Director of the LCB a comprehensive report, including the ACAJ’s findings and any recommendations for proposed legislation ([NRS 176.0125](#)).

#### [Advisory Commission on the Administration of Justice’s Subcommittee on Criminal Justice Information Sharing](#)

[The ACAJ’s Subcommittee on Criminal Justice Information Sharing](#) was tasked with examining various issues related to criminal justice information sharing, including those related to the Nevada Criminal Justice Information System. The Subcommittee must also prepare and submit to the ACAJ a comprehensive report that includes the recommendations of the Subcommittee.

## Legislative Committee on Child Welfare and Juvenile Justice

The Legislative Committee on Child Welfare and Juvenile Justice was created as a statutory committee by the 2009 Nevada Legislature based on a recommendation made by the Legislative Committee on Health Care. The Committee is charged with evaluating and reviewing issues related to the provision of child welfare services in this state, including licensing and reimbursement of providers of foster care; mental health services; compliance with federal requirements regarding child welfare; and juvenile justice in this state.

## Committee to Conduct an Interim Study of Issues Relating to Driving Under the Influence of Marijuana

Assembly Concurrent Resolution 7 (2019) created the Committee to Conduct an Interim Study of Issues Relating to Driving Under the Influence of Marijuana. The Committee must consider related scientific evidence, arrest and conviction data available from Nevada and other states that have legalized the use of marijuana, approaches taken by other states to address the issue, products and methods used to determine impairment at the roadside, existing relevant Nevada laws, and the impact of changes in laws that may affect employment and labor laws.

## Committee to Conduct an Interim Study of Issues Relating to Pretrial Release of Defendants in Criminal Cases

Senate Concurrent Resolution 11 (2019) directed the Legislative Commission to appoint the Committee to Conduct an Interim Study of Issues Relating to Pretrial Release of Defendants in Criminal Cases to examine issues relating to pretrial release and detention in Nevada.

## REPORTS FROM THE NEVADA JUDICIARY

The Nevada Judiciary publishes an Annual Report highlighting Nevada's court system, including technological achievements, court improvements, and judicial education. The report also shows statistics and facts about the number and types of cases adjudicated in the courts for the past fiscal year.
