COMMITTEE BRIEF 2021–2022 INTERIM JANUARY 21, 2022

INTRODUCTION

This brief provides information on the Joint Interim Standing Committee on Natural Resources, including an overview of natural resources issues the Committee may consider during the 2021–2022 Legislative Interim, meeting dates, and Committee staff contact information.

The members of the Subcommittee on Public Lands will be appointed by the chair of the Joint Interim Standing Committee on Natural Resources during the Committee's first hearing.

POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE COMMITTEE

Assembly Bill 443 (2021) created the Joint Interim Standing Committee on Natural Resources and set forth its membership, duties, powers, and jurisdictions. The Interim Standing Committee may do the following: (a) evaluate and review issues within the jurisdiction of the corresponding standing committee or committees from the preceding regular session of the Legislature; (b) exercise any of the investigative powers set forth in *Nevada Revised Statutes* (NRS) 218E.105 to 218E.140, inclusive; and (c) within the limits of the Committee's budget, conduct studies directed by the Legislature or the Legislative Commission.

Additionally, AB 443 replaced the Legislative Committee on Public Lands with the Subcommittee on Public Lands of the Joint Interim Standing Committee on Natural Resources. The Subcommittee retained its duties as set forth in NRS <u>218E.500</u> through <u>218E.525</u>. Its purpose is to provide a forum for discussion of policies and issues related to land owned or controlled by the federal government (public lands), which in Nevada accounts for over 85 percent of the state. The Subcommittee monitors and makes recommendations for action and legislation on a wide range of public lands issues, such as: conservation, environmental quality, federal land management policies, grazing, military bases, mining, recreation, water, wilderness, wildfire, and wildlife.

Lastly, the Committee may request up to 14 bill draft requests (BDR) for the 2023 Session that address issues related to natural resources. At least 4 BDRs must relate to public land matters based on the recommendations by the Subcommittee on Public Lands.



COMMITTEE JURISDICTION

The Committee generally has jurisdiction over a wide range of issues concerning natural resources. During past legislative sessions, the Senate and Assembly Committees on Natural Resources have considered measures related to the following topics: agriculture, animals, conservation and environmental policies, food safety, forestry, grazing, historic preservation, mining, public lands, recycling, state parks and monuments, water, wildfire, and wildlife.
