

Who Is Affected By Domestic Violence?










Domestic Violence Offenses

5-vr Comparison: 2015-2019


Protection Orders Issued



What's Not Working

- 76% of children will repeat the cycle of domestic violence without intervention (Cheering for Children)
- 1 in 7 children is affected by polyvictimization
- Children do not know what is not appropriate when they grow up with it!
- 75% of Cupcake Girls clients were foster kids!
- Youth who witness violence have the same brain activity as children who are being directly abused

POSSIBLE Next Steps



What Can We Do Soon?

- Use ARPA Funds to build and open One Safe Place, a model survivor resource center and transformational housing to support the needs of survivors and children today and into the future.
- With findings from Batterer's Treatment research, re-imagine and pilot batterer's treatment program, including essential data collection. (Fall 2022)
- Review the research from survivors and what they want for justice! Proposed legislation that matches that need. (Summer 2022)
- Investigate youth curriculum and delivery models to build legislation to mandate information is given to children. (Summer 2022)
- One number! With an integrated backend for all providers, but a 24/7 safety net such that no call, text, chat goes unanswered. (Rollout Fall 2022)
- Create (something to keep momentum)
