### **NEVADA REVISED STATUTES (NRS)** 439.519

#### SUBCOMMITTEE MEMBERS

The Advisory Council may appoint interested persons and governmental entities to serve on the Subcommittee including, without limitation:

- Public health agencies;
- Public and private insurers;
- Providers of primary care, including, without limitation, physicians and advanced practice registered nurses who provide primary care; and
- Recipients of health care services.

#### POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE SUBCOMMITTEE

- Study the delivery of health care through patient-centered medical homes (Section 3[c] of NRS 439.519);
- Patient-centered medical home means a primary care practice that:
  - Offers patient-centered, continuous, culturally competent, evidence-based, comprehensive health care that is led by a provider of primary care and a team of health care providers, coordinates the health care needs of the patient, and uses enhanced communication strategies and health information technology; and
  - Emphasizes enhanced access to practitioners and preventive care to improve the outcomes for and experiences of patients and lower the costs of health services (Section 4[a] of NRS 439A.190.

#### **BACKGROUND**

#### **LEGISLATION**

2015—<u>Senate Bill 6</u> (Chapter 308, *Statutes of Nevada*), sponsored by the Senate Committee on Health Care, authorizes the Advisory Council to appoint an advisory group to study the delivery of health care through patient-centered medical homes. The bill prohibits a primary care practice from representing itself as a patient-centered medical home unless it is certified, accredited, or otherwise officially



recognized as such by a nationally recognized organization for accrediting patient-centered medical homes. Finally, the bill authorizes the coordination between patient-centered medical homes and insurers and the acceptance of incentives provided by insurers to patient-centered medical homes, which would otherwise constitute unfair methods of competition or unfair trade practices to the extent that such coordination and incentives are authorized under federal law.

#### LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

No legislative histories of SB 6 have been compiled.

#### REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE

There is no requirement for the Subcommittee to submit a report to the Legislature.
