### Why Early Learning Programs?



**90%** of brain growth occurs by age five. Disadvantaged children can show up at kindergarten already **18 months behind** and knowing **half** as many words.



If children start school ready to learn, they are **twice as likely** to read at grade level by third grade.



If children read at grade level by third grade they are **4 times** more likely to graduate from high school.



If U.S. children graduate from high school, on average they will earn \$500k more, live 9 years longer and be 6 times less likely to be arrested. In OECD countries, similar gain is \$250k for men, \$150k for women


#### The Brain Science Behind ECE





### Kindergarten is Too Late to Start







### 21st- Century Job Requirements





### Early Education in Nevada

- 226,796 children age 0-51
- 49,228 total EEC supply<sup>1</sup>
  - 9,356 in HS and PreK
- 92 (out of 881) with national accreditation<sup>1</sup>
- 69% of 3-4 year olds do not attend ANY type of PreK program (US average: 54%)<sup>2</sup>
- 42% of licensed staff have <HS Diploma<sup>1</sup>
