

## Purpose of Zoom School/EL Funding



### **Background**

- Zoom School funding targeted low-performing schools with highest percentage of English learners (EL) in Clark (CCSD) and Washoe (WCSD) County School Districts as Zoom Schools
- EL funding provided to other districts and State Public Charter
   School Authority to provide services for EL students

### **Program Goals**

- Improve English language proficiency of EL students
- Improve academic achievement of EL students

## Impacts of COVID-19 on English Learners



Challenges	Finding Solutions
EL Assessment and Identification	Provisional identification of English learners during school closures
Student Access to Technology and Quality Instruction	<ul> <li>Ensure student access to technology and connectivity</li> <li>Build educator capacity to provide hybrid instruction using distance learning methods</li> </ul>
Diminished EL Enrollments in Public Schools	<ul> <li>Targeted efforts to contact families</li> <li>Enrollment options based on family needs</li> </ul>
Social/Emotional Needs of ELs and Families	Assign school/district staff to contact families to identify specific needs and access to services

### Impact of COVID-19 on Assessment of English Learners




 Annual academic assessments (Math and English/Language Arts) for 2019-2020 were canceled.

 The assessment participation rates of students were significantly impacted for 2020-2021.

Annual English language proficiency assessment must be administered face-to-face. WIDA administered both 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 (EL participation impacted).

## **English Mastery Council**



The Nevada State Legislature established the English Mastery Council (EMC) in 2013 to provide specific recommendations to the State Board of Education, Commission on Professional Standards, the Board of Regents, and local school districts regarding English learner supports and services, including the training and preparation of educators.

(NRS 388.409)

### **EMC: District EL Policies & Plans**



The EMC completes annual reviews of District Policies and Plans to ensure that they are aligned with expectations and the law.

Feedback is provided to each district and the State Board of Education based on those reviews.

## **EMC: English Language Acquisition & Development** (ELAD) Endorsement



In order to better prepare preservice teachers to meet the needs of English learners, the EMC made specific recommendations to the State Board of Education and Commission on Professional Standards regarding coursework that is included in the ELAD endorsement.

Nevada's public colleges and universities are at varying levels of implementation as they work to integrate ELAD coursework with other classes.

### EMC: English Language Development (ELD) Standards Framework



To assist teachers in implementing Nevada's ELD Standards, the EMC recommended that NDE develop an instructional framework. Several members of the EMC have served in a consultative capacity.

Purpose of the ELD Standards Framework: To assist teachers more effectively design and deliver instruction that builds English language skills and provides equitable access to rigorous content for English learners.
