Overview of Apprenticeships



Apprenticeship Ready Program

- Align directly to a registered apprenticeship to ensure direct entry into the apprenticeship
- Students may begin the program while in high school with classes at school and job training off-campus

Pre-apprenticeship

- Individuals 18 and older and already employed and preparing for an apprenticeship offered at the company or labor group

Registered Apprenticeship

- Individuals 18 and older with a high school diploma or equivalent with some programs having options for individuals under 18 years of age
- Combination of on-the-job training and related instruction

Qualifications for Apprentices



NAC 610.830 Standards for qualification: General requirements for educational achievement. ([NRS 610.090](#), [610.144](#))

1. Any educational achievement required as a qualification for admission to a pool must be directly related to the performance of the job, as demonstrated by showing a significant statistical relationship between the achievement and the performance of the job in the apprenticeship program, under the criteria set forth in 41 C.F.R. Part 60-3.
2. Records of schools or a passing grade on a general educational development test which is recognized by the State Board of Education or by a local authority controlling public instruction is evidence of educational achievement.
3. Educational requirements must apply uniformly to all applicants.


NAC 610.833 Standards for qualification: High school diploma or equivalent; modification or suspension of requirements. ([NRS 610.090](#), [610.144](#))

1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, an apprentice must:
 - (a) Have a high school diploma or its equivalent before being accepted into a program; or
 - (b) Receive a high school diploma or its equivalent:
 - (1) Within 1 year after being indentured as an apprentice; or
 - (2) Upon completion of a school to work program or a welfare to work program.
2. The Council may modify or suspend the requirements set forth in subsection 1 on its own initiative or at the request of a sponsor if the Council determines that the modification or suspension is consistent with the proper supervision, training, safety and continuity of employment of an apprentice and, if applicable, with any provisions of a collective bargaining agreement.



- Nevada Alliance for Youth Apprenticeship
 - Statewide effort to support and expand the development of Registered Apprenticeship Programs (RAP) and broadening the scope to include aligned pre-apprenticeships that engage youth in the RAP pipeline, beginning in high school or at age 16
 - Coordinated through Nevada System of Higher Education Workforce Development Office
 - Truckee Meadows Community College and Washoe County School District are starting a Certified Nursing Assistant Youth Apprenticeship


Overall WBL Participation



WBL Participation by Activity




Participation in Work-based Learning Opportunities



WBL Participation by Student Population




2019-20 Work-based Learning and Statewide Enrollment





- Assembly Bill 38 (2021)
 - Removed restricting language that limited WBL to CTE students
 - Requires the reporting of disaggregated data

 - Provides schools and school districts more flexibility
