Objective: Retain local control over water resources


Population: 440,000 people (130,000 service connections)

Demand: 83,000 Acre-Feet Annually

Renewables: 3 Hydroelectric Plants ≈ Offset \$3.5M in Costs











Truckee River Basin Snowpack

- Upper Watershed Forest Management






