Good morning Chair Denis, Vice-Chair Carlton and fellow Committee Members,

I, Julie Beasley, Ph.D. am writing to express support in favor of the Grant A Gift Autism Foundation – Ackerman Center’s (GGAF Ackerman Center) \$8.5 Mil ARPA request. The incidence rate of an autism diagnosis is growing each year. In 2022, the CDC quoted that 1:44 children will receive an autism diagnosis. This diagnosis knows no socioeconomic bounds and affects all levels equally. Unfortunately, in the state of Nevada there are simply not enough specialist to provide this diagnosis and even fewer that accept state funded insurance plans, leaving thousands of families on waitlists that can span several years. It’s time to give support to those families and the community that can be served through the GGAF Ackerman Center.

The impact from these funds allotted will help countless families, beyond just receiving the diagnosis. It will help them perform better in school, start to receive the necessary therapies recommended, gain a better understanding of their diagnosis and when ready, help them find and obtain gainful employment.
