My oldest daughter, Charly Begay, has grown up with our cultural and traditional beliefs. She has supported and participated in Navajo ceremonies. She is proud. This is the same for Boston, my youngest daughter. To think that she may not get to show her pride to her school family is baffling to me. Our traditional dress and regalia is a part of who she is. Formal schooling is important to our family. My mother did not graduate high school. My grandmother did not attend any formal school, thankfully. But, these ladies now see the importance of school in today's society and they want to support their grandchildren. Allowing Charly to walk across the stage and receive her High School diploma in traditional dress and regalia will bring so much pride, happiness, acceptance, beauty to our family and to the Las Vegas community.

I close with hopes that you hear our voice.
