### **Board of Dental Examiners of Nevada**

### Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS)Chapter 631:

**Board members** (NRS 631.120 through 631.140): The Board consists of 11 members appointed by the Governor as follows:

- Six members who are dentists, residents of Nevada, and have practiced in Nevada for at least five years;
- One member who represents persons or agencies that provide health care to patients who are indigent, uninsured, or unable to afford health care; this person may be licensed under Chapter 631;
- Three members who are dental hygienists, residents of Nevada, and have practiced in Nevada for at least five years; and
- One member who represents the general public and who is not a dentist or hygienist or a relative of a dentist or hygienist.

Dental hygienists may not participate in the grading of licensing examinations of dentists. An unlicensed member of the Board shall not participate in grading any examinations required by the Board.

Appointments of the members must represent geographic areas of the State (NRS 631.140).

**Powers and duties of the Board:** The Board shall (NRS 631.190):

- Adopt rules and regulations;
- Appoint committees, examiners, agents, attorneys, investigators, consultants, and other employees as necessary;
- Examine and license applicants and collect fees;
- Maintain a roster of licensed dentists and hygienists; and
- Keep records which must be open to public inspection.

The Attorney General, in his or her discretion, may serve as legal counsel for the Board in any matters and at any time.

### **Operations of the Board:**

- The Board shall elect its officers who hold office for one year. The Board shall define the duties of the officers and the Executive Director (NRS 631.160); and
- The Board shall meet whenever necessary to examine applicants and may also meet at such other times as it deems proper (NRS 631.170).

Re: Review of Nevada State Board of Dental Examiners

Dear Chairman James Settelmeyer:

According to Nevada Revised Statutes ("NRS") in Chapter 232B, Subsection 220, the Sunset Subcommittee of the Legislative Commission is to do the following:

"[C]onduct a review of each board and commission in this State...to determine whether the board or commission should be terminated, modified, consolidated with another board or commission or continued."

Currently, one board under review is the Nevada State Board of Dental Examiners ("BDE"). On Friday, November 20<sup>th</sup>, I attended the board meeting for the BDE. To a public member attending the meeting the BDE appeared to be heavily dominated by its attorney and executive director, which seemed to be most apparent when a dental licensee appeared before the BDE (see Exhibit 1).

According to NRS Chapter 232B, Subsection 51, the Sunset Subcommittee of the Legislative Commission is to make "considerations in determining need for continued operation of the agency." Some questions are provided here for the Subcommittee to review. Based on my observations, I am providing some proposed answers to those questions in NRS 232B.051 in regards to the BDE:

- Is there a reasonable relationship between this exercise of the state's police power and the protection of the public health, safety or welfare? Would the absence or reduction of regulation by this agency significantly harm or endanger the public health, safety or welfare?
  - a. NO. The BDE is selectively prosecuting licensees over philosophical differences in the standard of care where there has been no harm to patients, no malpractice, and no bad outcomes.
  - b. NO. The Attorney General's office can prosecute actual violations of the law such as gross negligence or illegal activities.
- 2. Is there another, less restrictive, method of regulation which could adequately protect the public? YES. The BDE members could assign volunteer mediators amongst themselves or licensees to resolve disputes where they actually arise between patients and dentists.

- 3. Does regulation have the effect of directly or indirectly increasing the cost of any goods or services involved and, if so, is the increase justified by the protection provided to the public?
  - a. YES. The BDE has significantly increased costs to themselves and licensees by employing a private attorney for there appears to exercise be no fiscal controls over fees and costs of "investigations," legal billings, etc.
  - b. NO. These same services could be provided at a markedly reduced cost from the Attorney General's Office and/or through volunteer mediation.
- 4. Are any of the agency's programs or objectives duplicated by other governmental agencies or nonprofit organizations or by private enterprise? YES. See above (e.g., Attorney General's Office, mediation, arbitration, etc.). In addition, there are other agencies available for monitoring impaired dentists where BDE should be confidentially referring such licensees for rehabilitation as opposed to publicly prosecuting and persecuting them for self-reporting.

According to NRS 232B.240, after the above questions have been answered the Sunset Subcommittee must then "submit reports on, the need for the termination, modification, consolidation or continued operation of a board or commission." In this case, the BDE should be modified to have more oversight and accountability for greater fiscal responsibility. Further, all disciplinary actions other than gross negligence or illegal activities, referred to mediation as opposed to a private attorney. All impaired dentists should be referred for rehabilitation, not prosecuted where there has been no harm.

Moreover, according to NRS 232B.250, once the Sunset Subcommittee has made a determination it "must include suggestions for appropriate direct legislative action, if any, which would make the operation of the board or commission or its successor more efficient or effective." Such suggestions could include the following:

- 1. Place all medical boards under one Professional Licensing Board (e.g., similar to other states such as GA, IN, MA, MD, PA, SC, UT, WI, etc.) for greater efficiency in licensing and credentialing; and
- Establish a uniform disciplinary process in the Healing Arts Chapter 629 of Nevada Revised Statutes (e.g., similar to the State Bar of Nevada) where due process rights are guaranteed, limits are imposed on fees and costs, and licensees are only prosecuted for gross negligence and/or illegal activities, but not for philosophical differences in standard of care.

### **EXHIBIT 1**

### NRS 631.131

BDE's attorney appears to be actively involved in "investigations." However, NRS 631.131 clearly states "*The investigator shall not participate in the hearing conducted by the Board.*" Yet, BDE's attorney appears to be the "chief investigator," who is actively involved in hiring, paying, and giving direction to "investigators."

### **Attorney Fees and Costs**

BDE's attorney stated during its meeting on Nov. 20<sup>th</sup> that he had filed an action with District Court to obtain an order for his legal fees to be paid by Dr. Scott Brooksby. Typically, in civil court, such fees are rarely granted in the absence of some prior agreement to do so. Moreover, there may be some lack of fiscal responsibility here on the part of the BDE in that the BDE does not appear to be exercising any control over the fees and costs being generated by its attorney during investigations of BDE licensees. If so, it is likely due to the foreknowledge that whatever legal fees BDE's attorney generates BDE will require its licensees to pay as part of their Settlement Agreements. In the aforementioned action, BDE's attorney is seeking to have Brooksby pay \$51,000 (\$39,000 for Brooksby and \$12,000 for his daughter) in spite of the fact that "the [hearing] judge ruled...that she would not have to pay the attorney's fees." Of course, these fees would be dramatically less if the Dental Board had chosen to use a Deputy Attorney General from the Attorney General's Office.

### Fiscal Responsibility

The BDE has a debt of \$429,013.00 for their pension fund. According to recent audit, the BDE also paid \$103,315.00 in legal fees to its attorney and \$90,490.70 to its executive director for a total expenditure of \$193,805.70 at the end its fiscal year ending on June 30, 2015. [NOTE: During the BDE's meeting on June 19, 2015, the BDE increased the salary for its executive director to \$120,000, which with benefits comes to \$161,000.00 for the next fiscal year (see Minutes from Nevada State Board of Dental Examiners, June 19, 2015, p. 3)].

### **Investigators**

Any or all of the "investigators" the BDE is using are required to be licensed by the Nevada Private Investigators Licensing Board ("PILB") under NRS 648. According to the PILB, if the BDE or BDE attorney is employing outside individuals or third parties to do "investigations" then such persons must be licensed by PILB or they are in violation of Nevada law. If BDE is using unlicensed investigators, then each and every case where such "investigators" were used should be reviewed with the possible outcome that records may need to be expunged and costs of "investigations" reimbursed to BDE licensees.

### <u>Licensee #1: Reduction In Attorney Fees Denied</u>

Scott Brooksby, DDS appeared before the BDE and literally asked for "mercy" in regards to excessive legal fees the BDE's attorney had charged to him and included in his Settlement Agreement. Not one single BDE member showed any compassion nor did they offer to modify costs because the item on the agenda was only to "waive" his costs, although a motion could possibly have been made to modify his fees and costs. BDE's attorney interrupted Brooksby multiple times while Brooksby was addressing the BDE. This is a good example where a mediator could have used as BDE's attorney has a possible

financial conflict of interest in the Settlement Agreement. Moreover, this appears to be a case where no patient was actually harmed other than a filling falling out, and no malpractice was committed. Rather, it is a case where the BDE pursued an investigation of a licensee over a philosophical difference of opinion regarding the standard of care.

### Licensee #2: Modification To Stipulation Agreement Denied

Travis Sorenson, DDS asked the Board to remove the term "probation" from his Stipulation Agreement as the inclusion of this term has prevented insurance companies from paying for his work and prevented him from obtaining employment. This was a simple request for someone who self-reported, completed rehabilitation, and was in compliance with all the terms of his supervision and monitoring. In fact, the Disciplinary Screening Officer in Sorenson's case, Ted Twesne, DDS, stated during the BDE's meeting on September 18th that not only was Sorenson in complete compliance with his Agreement but that it was never Twesne's intent that Sorenson should be prevented from working. It appears the term "probation" was purposefully included in the Agreement so as to constructively suspend Sorenson's license where there otherwise was no suspension or revocation. This is in direct opposition to the memo BDE's attorney had previously provided BDE regarding "remedial" and "corrective" action where he wrote, "A remedial or corrective action stipulation will contain no provisions for revocation, suspension, probation, reprimand, fine, or restriction of practice....[as when] any one of these provisions is contained in a stipulated agreement, it must be reported to the NPDB (i.e., a disciplinary stipulation)" (see "The Domino Effect of Board Complaints," John Hunt, Esq., p. 5). This parallels what is done with other state Dental Boards, including Arizona where Sorenson is also licensed. Yet, BDE's attorney adamantly opposed the removal of the term "probation" during BDE's meeting on November 20th by arguing, "If we do it for him we'll have to do it for everyone." Of course, such argument is illogical since all decisions are made on a case-by-case basis. While one of the BDE's purposes is "to protect the public" there was no patient harmed in this case. Moreover, this is the first time in the BDE's history where one of its licensees self-reported. In spite of this fact, not one BDE member expressed any concern or compassion for Dr. Sorenson in a matter that should have been handled privately and confidentially as it is in other jurisdictions. Instead, the BDE exercised poor judgment in publicly vilifying Sorenson and thus, virtually guaranteed that no dental licensee will ever self-report to the BDE again. As a result, the BDE's action will likely have the opposite intended effect in that it may now have placed the public at greater risk from impaired dentists who will not self-report.

### **Misleading Statement**

When speaking to the BDE in re: Brooksby, BDE's attorney stated to the Board that "ozone is a poisonous gas." This is a misleading statement since toxicity or remedy for any and all drugs is determined by the amount. Further, ozone is, in fact, used by 15,000 healthcare practitioners in Europe for medical purposes and it is legal for medical use in Nevada by alternative medical practitioners. In the case of Brooksby, where he allegedly used ozone and hypnosis for his patients, as opposed to anesthetic gas and drugs that have potential side-effects (incl., death), one could make the argument that Dr. Brooksby was actually practicing above (not below) the standard of care in that he was doing less potential harm to his patients than other dentists due to his additional training and experience.

### **Employer Liability**

It should be noted that BDE members are responsible for all actions of their attorney and executive director under employer liability (see NRS 41.745).

### THE DOMINO EFFECT OF BOARD COMPLAINTS

For a licensed health care professional, receiving a complaint from their licensing board ("Board") can truly be an unnerving event which can set into motion any number of other events, i.e., the domino effect. The goal of this article is provide licensees with a general outline of the various factors to consider when deciding how to respond to a Board complaint.

In Nevada, each of the health care professional Boards have their own statutes and regulations which, in varying degrees specificity the standards and procedures governing the complaint and its process. Obtaining and reviewing the relevant statutes and regulations should be the starting point when beginning to address how to respond to a Board complaint.

The first question usually asked by a licensee is whether they need an attorney to respond to the complaint. Hiring an attorney can be a very expensive proposition. Sometimes, however, a licensee's malpractice insurance will cover, to one extent or another, representation and defense of a Board complaint. A licensee should carefully review their insurance policy and/or speak with his or her agent about such coverage. If coverage is available, it usually will not cover reimbursement to a complainant or reimbursement of the Board's attorney's fees/costs incurred by the Board during the course of the investigation.

If coverage is available, the licensee should consider requesting the insurer to assign one attorney to address the Board's complaint and another to address any related civil malpractice case, if any. This consideration is suggested because both types of matters have their own goals, claims, standards, procedure, and the like. Sometimes, these goals might be seen as coming in conflict with one another. For example, in a civil malpractice context, the attorney may be very leery of the licensee making any admission but, in the administrative context before a Board,

an admission may be required to resolve a pending investigation. The effects of any such admission in one arena need to be carefully considered in another arena.

If insurance coverage is not available, various factors come into play when deciding whether to hire a private attorney to assist in responding to a Board complaint. Such factors include the licensee's past history with the Board, whether the licensee has had prior complaint with the Board, whether the Board has taken prior action against the licensee, the relative seriousness of the complaint, the relative complexity of the complaint. If the Board's complaint appears to only address a relatively simple matter and the licensee has no history with the Board, a licensee may decide hiring a private attorney may be unnecessary. It is suggested, however, when in doubt, do not be penny wise and pound foolish. At a minimum, a licensee may want to consult an experience administrative law attorney to have the attorney review the complaint and answer prepared by the licensee. In the end, it probably is always in the licensee's best interest to have experienced legal counsel in dealing with Board matters.

In crafting a response to a Board complaint, whether with or without an attorney, it is critical to understand that trained investigators and Board members — most of whom are also trained licensees in the applicable field — will be the ones reviewing the matter. Overstating a position or responding as if the targeted reader were a lay person simply will not be effective. The Board personnel reading the response are general experts in the licensee's field. If a licensee thinks they will be able to fool the Board or dazzle them with their credentials or jargon common to the field, they should be disabused of that position sooner rather than later. The Board is generally comprised of the licensee's peers who will know whether a response is truly warranted and/or cannot be justified.

Before addressing the allegations in a Board's complaint, a licensee is probably best served by telling the Board about his/her background, education,

awards, community service, experience, years in practice, other licenses, etc. If the licensee has had no prior Board actions, he/she may want to consider addressing the years of exemplary service provided to the community. A copy of the licensee's curriculum vitae should be attached to any answer submitted to the Board.

If it is reasonable to assume the result of the investigation could result in either revocation, suspension, probation, restriction of practice, or a fine then the licensee should seriously consider engaging an expert sooner rather than later to assist in preparing the response to the Board. It is generally more advantageous to provide the Board with an expert's opinions at the earlier stages of the process, as opposed to waiting until the latter, i.e., a formal board hearing. Like in a civil matter, the expert should be provided all available material to review. If possible, a licensee may want to retain an expert who is also licensed in Nevada and who is readily familiar with the applicable standards of care.

What can the licensee expect after submitting the written response to the Board's complaint? Initially, shortly after submitting the written response, the licensee or attorney should consider contacting the Board to make inquiry if any addition information or documents are needed. Such an innocuous inquiry may garner tremendous benefits in that it may open channels of communication which might be helpful in satisfactorily resolving the matter. If there is a reply to the licensee's response, most Boards will provide the license with a copy. Sometimes, the licensee may be able to provide a supplemental response. After the complaint, response and any supplemental responses are evaluated by the Board, a number of options are available to the Board, including dismissing the matter, entering into a stipulated agreement, or proceeding to a formal hearing.

Licensees obviously seek to have the complaint dismissed. In determining whether to dismiss the complaint, Boards take various matters into consideration,

including the licensee's prior history with the Board, the severity of the complaint, standard of care, documentary evidence, whether the licensee acknowledged any wrong doing which may be of import to allay any concerns raised in the complaint. Instead of dismissal, some Boards may remand the matter with or without concern to the licensee's file and in doing so; the Board may also indicate what matters, if any, raised in the complaint that may be revisited in the event the licensee should receive future complaints.

If the complaint is not dismissed, the licensee should seriously consider or reevaluate hiring experienced administrative counsel, if not done already. If the complaint is not dismissed or remanded to the licensee's file, then the complaint will continue to be processed by the Board and further action will be forthcoming. Boards, however, are generally amenable to entering into stipulated agreements, sometimes referred to as consent orders, to resolve complaints.

If at all possible, the licensee should attempt to resolve the complaint at this stage (i.e., shortly after it is learned the complaint is not being dismissed or remanded to the licensee's file) pursuant to a stipulated agreement. It is probably safe to say that should the licensee proceed to a full Board hearing and the Board finds violations, the severity of the final Board action will exceed that of the terms and conditions earlier offered in a stipulated agreement. Further, a stipulated agreement will generally allow the licensee to avoid a public hearing and avoid having to provide testimony under oath which may be used in a judicial setting.

Generally, there are two types of stipulated agreements which may be offered to resolve a complaint. One requires the Board to report the action taken to the National Practitioners Data Bank (NPDB). This type of stipulated agreement is sometimes referred to as a disciplinary stipulation. The other type of stipulated agreement is purely remedial and generally does not require the Board to submit an adverse action report to the NPDB. This type of stipulated agreement is sometimes

referred to as a remedial or corrective action stipulation. It is important to note both types of stipulations will be deemed to be a public record.

A remedial or corrective action stipulation will contain no provisions for revocation, suspension, probation, reprimand, fine, or restriction of practice. If any one of these provisions is contained in a stipulated agreement, it must be reported to the NPDB (i.e., a disciplinary stipulation). A remedial or corrective action stipulated agreement usually will require the licensee to obtain supplemental education, reimburse the complainant, and/or reimburse the Board's attorneys fees, costs, and/or investigative expenses. Lastly instead of probation, a licensee may consent to his practice being voluntarily monitored for a given period of time.

Short of dismissal or remand to the licensee's file, a corrective action stipulation should be pursued as it generally does not require an adverse action report to the NPDB, which could start other proverbial dominos to fall, as addressed below. It becomes critical in drafting a response and negotiating with the Board to not only address the Complaint, but also recognize and try and plan for the consequences of any resolution with the Board.

Board action, whether order or stipulation, could impact other areas of the licensee's professional life:

- \* If the Board's action involves either revocation, suspension, fined or restriction upon practice, there must be an adverse action report reported to the NPDB. A Report to the NPDB can trigger a number of adverse effects. For instance, an adverse action report the NPDB can impact provider contracts with insurance companies. It is not uncommon for provider contracts to contain language allowing the insurance company to terminate the provider contract based upon an adverse action report.
- \* In addition, an adverse action reported to the NPDB may also affect hospital privileges.

- \* An adverse action report also may impact your membership in professional associations. For instance, certifying boards, national memberships, and local memberships, different professional associations.
- \* Further, if an adverse action report involves the reporting of a felony conviction or plea, the Office of the Inspector General ("OIG") may choose to issue an order restricting the physician's ability, for a period of five (5) years, to render care to Medicaid and Medicare patients.

Clearly, it's not just the action of the Board that a licensee must consider when deciding to proceed to a full-board hearing or enter into a stipulation with the Board. Depending on the action taken by the Board, it can create a domino effect which must be addressed by licensee. As one might expect, each of the above referenced entities have their own reporting requirements, procedures, timelines, regulations, terms and condition which must be reviewed, analyzed, and considered.

If the likely result is an adverse action, then the licensee, prior to the Board adopting any actions must be aware that most provider contracts, hospital privileges, and professional associations, as well as the OIG, require such action be reported to them within a given time-frame. It is critical for the provider to know the reporting requirements of the respective entities so as not to run afoul of them, which in some cases, may result in automatic termination of the provider contract, hospital privileges, professional association membership, or the ability to provide Medicare and Medicaid services.

Depending on the severity, if it is contemplated that eventually the Board is going to file an adverse action and it involves either a revocation, suspension, probation, restriction of practice or a fine, the licensee must consider taking a proactive approach and place insurers, hospitals, professional associations and possibly the OIG on notice about the anticipated Board action before it is finalized.

The licensee may also want to consider withdrawing from these entities prior to Board action if the contemplated action could result in the termination of the relationship between the licensee and the entity. Withdrawal prior to a final action by the Board usually will negate the necessity of the entity filing an adverse action report to the NPDB.

In closing it is hoped this article given some insight to the administrative complaint process. However the best advice of all to avoid a complaint in the first place is to always communicate positively with your patients. Bad bedside manners and failure to communicate is usually the countless basis for the initiation of complaints to the Board which otherwise would never have been filed.

Pursuant to NRS 241.030(a), the board may, by motion, enter into closed session to consider the character, alleged misconduct, professional competence, or physical or mental health of a person.

Mrs. Hummel indicated to the Board that there were a couple of policies and procedures for them to consider, such as employee performance and compensation review. She noted to the board that she was speaking about the employees as a whole and not one employee in particular. She stated that if they were so inclined, they could to grant a merit increase/bonuses, and cost-of-living increase (maximum of 3%). Mrs. Wark asked if Mrs. Hummel

could explain or advise them of her opinion regarding the differences between merit increases versus bonuses, furthermore, what the downside would be for a merit increase as opposed to a bonus. Mrs. Hummel explained that if an employee has gone well above and beyond they would be receive an increase in pay based on merit,; she stated that there could be an employee that performs at a minimum which they could choose to not grant such an employee a merit increase. She added that a bonus would not be based on merit. Her recommendation would be to implement that the Executive Director be able to make a recommendation for merits increases or bonuses based on their employee review. She stated that the employee reviews were usually given the first week of June.

Dr. Blasco stated that any kind of merit increase would be based on how an employee performs and how much they go above and beyond, rather than for an employee that does what they are paid to show up and do. Mrs. Wark inquired if a merit increase would be easier for them to budget for. Mrs. Hummel stated to the Board that the of a cost-of-living increase hold a legal maximum of 3%, where a merit increase would be at the discretion of the recommendation of the Executive Director upon completing her employee reviews in June, which would get approved in June at the Board meeting and would become a part of the next fiscal year budget. She also noted that she would need to know if they would be granting a bonus for the holiday so that she can budget for it.

Ms. Guillen stated that she liked that the ED would be the one determining when the merit raises are given because she is the one that sees the employees perform on a daily basis.

MOTION: Mrs. Wark made the motion to adopt the cost of living index with a maximum of 3% increase annually. Motion seconded by Ms. Guillen. All were in favor.

Executive Director. He added further that there were some questions; he did not see in the documentation any of the employee review evaluations, particularly related to the Executive Directors. Furthermore, he did not see any documentation showing the salaries of Executive Directors from other state agencies, which he believed would be helpful to allow comparing the salary of those with special credentials such as law degrees, certified account executives, or some type of a BPA. He asked that this item be tabled until the next meeting so that the Board members may be furnished with said the information he noted.

MOTION: Dr. Miller made the motion to table this item until the next Board meeting to allow time for the Board members to be provided documentation showing the salaries of Executive Directors with other state agencies, and be able to compare their salaries with those who hold special credentials. Discussion: He inquired if an evaluation had been done and, if so, requested to see it. Dr. Pinther indicated that there was no review and that he was uncertain of who would conduct the review of the Executive Director as she reports to them [Board members]. Mr. Hunt noted that there was a motion. Dr. Miller withdrew his motion to allow for further discussion from the Board.

Mrs. Wark inquired that if the Board wants to increase their reserve to \$1.2 million, then increasing Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel's salary by at least 30% would, perhaps, be irresponsible. She noted that Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel has done an amazing job, but was unsure it warranted a 30% increase in her salary base. Dr. Sill noted that the Board appears to be in order. He stated that the salary is in line with other Executive Director's salaries as far as the job descriptions go. He believed that it would be a fair increase.

MOTION: Dr .Sill made the motion to accept the recommendation to increase the Executive Director's compensation to \$120,000. Motion seconded by Dr. Blasco. Discussion: Mrs. Villigan inquired of Mrs. Hummel if the bonus granted to Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel in December was reflected in the budget. Mrs. Hummel responded and indicated that it was listed as an expense. Dr. Blasco added that as Chairman of the Budget and Finance Committee meeting, in discussing the numbers with Mrs. Hummel, there was no negative impact for operating expenses to bring Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel's salary to be comparable to other Executive Directors along with the knowledge that they want to reach a goal of having \$1.2 million in reserves to be reached during a multiple year endeavor. Dr. Pinther indicated that when he was the chair of the Executive Director Search Committee, he was lucky enough to interview many candidates, including Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel. He added that the Board elected to hire her due to her enthusiasm and vision to cut costs, and eliminate the position of the Deputy Executive Director, among other interoffice expenses. Further, that he believed her skill sets and all she has done for the Board spoke for itself, and thus believed the compensation is fair. Mrs. Wark stated that she, too, believed the Executive Director has done an amazing job; however, that she did not feel that it would be prudent for them to increase her salary by 30%, and that it may not be a fiscally responsible thing to do at this time. She added that, perhaps, this item should be tabled. Mrs. Solie inquired if the Budget & Finance Committee members could furnish the information they used to compare the compensation of other Executive Directors in similar capacities as the Board. Dr. Pinther indicated that they did not have a current copy, but that they would provide her with the information. She added that there was discussion of seeking to have the positions paid by the licensing fees from the Dental Board. She noted that it was the committee's recommendation to engage in discussions with the Dental Board about the possibility. She spoke of another discussion held regarding a recommendation to introduce one medical professional to the Dental Board and to add one dental professional to the Medical and Nursing Boards. She added further, that another recommendation was that should there be a legislative or regulation change requiring mandatory continuing education requirements for dental licensure and medical licensure to include a class regarding public health. She noted that there hope was to have dental, medical, and nursing professionals have a better understanding of each profession and how it relates to the need for oral health. She mentioned the discussion the committee had to search for funding for programs that provide direct services for public health and the underserved, which lost funding during the recession, and that they are now looking to having conversations with the Board to discuss a possible formal process. She added that the committee was aware of the history of the Board to distribute money to public health programs. Board Counsel clarified to Ms. Garvey that the Board does not use fines to distribute money to the public. He indicated that the licensees that stipulate choose to voluntary make donations to different public health programs in lieu of some discipline or charges. He further clarified that fines must go to the general fund of the state. Ms. Garvey added that, perhaps, the discussion to have some of the

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underserved, public health programs make the list to be considered for donations for future instances of donations made per stipulation agreements. She lastly noted that they committee was also looking to discuss some of the NRS and NAC 631 codes regarding opening up the limitations in access to oral healthcare services.

MOTION: Ms. Guillen made the motion to accept the minutes. Motion seconded by Mrs. Villigan. All were in favor of the motion.

Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel indicated that Mrs. Hummel was present to answer any questions. Mrs. Hummel went over the Boards' financials. ## (I) Dr. X

Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel went over the evaluation inspection and the reasons for the recommendations. Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel indicated that at the time Dr. X had to cease continuing to administer when the site was found to be deficient. She noted that since that time Dr. X had rectified the deficient items.

MOTION: Dr. Miller made the motion to affirm the recommendations. Motion was seconded by Dr. Blasco. All were in favor of the motion.

\*b. Consideration to Grant a Re-evaluation of the Conscious Sedation Permit Holder by the Executive Director pursuant to NAC 631.2235 (2 and 3) (For Possible Action)

#### (1) Dr. X

Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel explained that should Dr. X wish to request a re-evaluation, the Board may authorize her to approve the re-evaluation to avoid a delay between scheduled Board meetings. She reiterated that the situation has since been rectified.

MOTION: Dr. Blasco made the motion to authorize the Executive Director to grant a re-evaluation should Dr. X request one. Motion was seconded by Dr. Sill. All were in favor of the motion.

Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel went over the rule change and what the Board's next step was to be. She went back and found that the average costs to conduct an inspection costs the Board \$200-\$250 per inspection.

MOTION: Dr. Miller made the motion to establish an interim fee for initial IC inspection requests to \$250. Motion seconded by Mrs. Solie. Discussion: Dr. Pisani inquired if there is additional staff time required. Dr. Miller inquired that should the Board implement the use of tablets (provided by GL) if it would essentially save some time. Dr. Blasco would like information on how much costs a re-inspection incurs. Mr. Hunt pointed out that the Board must consider the random inspections, so Board should make a regulation change regarding failures and requiring a summary suspension as a mechanism to keep safety in place. He indicated that only when the Board has a substantial amount of evidence that an office is not compliant with IC guidelines, they cannot conduct a random inspection. He added that if there is a complaint regarding the cleanliness of an office it is not considered an initial or a random inspection, and therefore, the Board has no mechanism in place to allow them to summary suspend someone for IC violations. Mrs. Villigan inquired if they could potentially refer cases to the Health Department, which it was indicated that they could. All were in favor.

# \*d. Approval of Reactivation of Dental License – NAC 631.170(5) (For Possible Action)

#### (I) William R Rohel, DDS

Dr. Rohel was present in the North. Mr. Hunt indicated that Dr. Rohel was asking for a license with restrictions as he has identified in his letter that he submitted. Should the Board issue Dr. Rohel the license with restrictions he advised them that they would have to report the restrictions to the NPDB. Mr. Hunt explained what the Board is required to report to the NPDB. Dr. Rohel indicated that he understood, but seemed uneasy about the restriction of licensure being reported to the NPDB. Mr. Hunt noted to Dr. Rohel that he could request to table this item so that he may seek legal advice. He was offered to go in to closed session, which he politely declined. Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel indicated that he was requesting to reinstate his license with restrictions as outlined in his letter. She added that they when she reports to the NPDB that she would note to them that Dr. Rohel elected to restrict his license due to medical issues. Dr. Rohel indicated that he wanted to volunteer for the Adopt=A-Vet program to make some dentures and appliances. Dr. Blasco indicated that he has not practiced dentistry since 2006 and that historically the board has required a clinical exam or remediation (skills assessment) in order to reinstate a license. Dr. Rohel commented that with his physical limitations that it would be difficult for him to pass a clinical. It was commented that Dr. Rohels best option would be a skills assessment that would be built around the skills he will be performing. Dr. Miller commented that perhaps they could require a skill assessment built around removable appliances. Mr. Hunt advised that it was to the Board's discretion. Dr. Pisani believed that Dr. Rohel would be a valuable asset, and that he further believed a reasonable alternative would be a skills assessment. Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel noted that a previous dentist with restrictions went to UNLV to have the skills assessment done. Mr. Hunt advised that the Board could say that they could issue a license with a list of restrictions, and that upon an assessment of certain areas, he can add/remove a restriction. Dr. Blasco inquired of Dr. Rohel asked if he had any tactile dysfunction. Dr. Rohel indicated that he would like to simply volunteer or fill in for a friend to watch over the practice. Dr. Sill noted that in the WREB exam they offer a pre-exam review of skills, and added that WREB may be willing to accommodate Dr. Rohel to take that portion only. Dr. Blasco noted that in 2013 a doctor presented himself with similar restrictions and the Board issued the license.

MOTION: Dr. Pisani made the motion to approve the reactivation of Dr. Rohel's dental license with restrictions to diagnosis and treatment planning, and that should he want to add to his restrictions he would have to complete a skills assessment for that specified skill. Motion seconded by Dr. Kinard. Both agreed to Mr. Hunts added language, that the skills assessment would be to add to his skills that he may conduct. All were in favor. AMENDED MOTION: Dr. Pisani amended his motion to include prescription writing so long as Dr. Rohel holds a license with the Nevada Pharmacy Board. Dr. Kinard amended his second to include Dr. Pisani's amended language. All were in favor.

Dr. Talley: indicated that he provided a chart on behalf of the NDA and emphasized that patient safety is their main concern and are opposed to the new sections. He proceeded to read his comment for the NDA into the record. Ms. Bobbett stated that her comments was submitted for the record.

# Public Workshops::

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\*3. Notice of Public Workshop, Request for Comments and review of Nevada Administrative Code Chapter 631 related to the practice of dentistry and dental hygiene and proposed regulation changes and/or Amendments to the following regulations; Schedule of Fees (NAC 631.029); Address Notification (NAC 631.150) Duties delegable to Dental Hygienists (NAC 631.210) and Duties delegable to Dental Assistants (NAC 631.220) (For Possible Action)

Board Counsel stated to the Board members that their duties as the Board in reviewing the regulations was paramount to see how the public will be impacted by any and all changes made regarding public safety. Board Counsel added that it was necessary to protect the public in every decision made. Board Counsel advised that they, during deliberations, must consider who will be impacted and whether or not the patient will be protected. He also reminded them to take into consideration the desires of the public.

• Schedule of Fees for the Initial Infection Control (IC) inspection:

Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel stated that the maximum fee that the Board may charge is \$500 pursuant to the Legislative change AB89, however that they had previously decided on setting the fee at \$250 in the interim upon review of the costs associated with conducted these types of infection control inspections. There was no public comment.

MOTION: Dr. Sill motion to approve that the fee be set to \$250. Motion seconded by Ms. Guillen. All were in favor of the motion.

Address Notifications:

Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel reminded them that this would require that licensees provide the Board with an email address.

MOTION: Mrs. Villigan made the motion to approve that the regulation requires licensees to provide an email address to the Board. Motion seconded by Dr. Miller. All were in favor of the motion.

Initial IC Inspections – Summary Suspension:

Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel stated that when a licensee opens a new office, or there is a transfer of ownership, the owners must request that an initial infection control inspection be done. She added that there are instances when a complaint is received regarding IC concerns and that when the Board receives a verified complaint, they can conduct an automatic office audit to ensure that the public is protected from potential harm resulting from improper IC procedures at an office. Mr. Hunt explained that there are scenarios where IC guidelines and procedures are not being followed and/or practiced properly and there is not a mechanism to require that an office close unless voluntarily done. By adding the option to summary suspend an office from rendering treatment, the Board will be protecting the public. Therefore, this change would grant the board the ability to summary suspend an office from practicing should something arise. Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel stated that she would correct the numeration of the regulation.

MOTION: Dr. Miller made the motion to approve the option of summary suspension. Motion was seconded by Ms. Solie. Public Comment: Ms. Xuan-Thu Failing inquired if the initial inspection was to help facilitate if there is a gross error in IC procedures. Mr. Hunt indicated that when there is a critical error, the dentist is immediately contacted and they can voluntarily stop practice until the errors have been rectified, if not the board will now have the ability to summary suspend their practice. All were in favor of the motion.

# • RDH - Duties Delegable:

Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel noted for the record that Ms. Chris Garvey submitted written public comment.

Public Comment: Mrs. Chandler spoke on the record in support of the proposed changes.

Ms. Failing commented that she was in support of the proposed changes, as it would help facilitate the day-to-day duties at the dental office.

# Opposing Comments:

Dr. Twesme commented that he was in opposition of the proposed changes. He gave the example of the removal of sutures and the potential complications that could arise if removed improperly or too soon by an inexperienced person. He continued to state several reasons and examples for his opposition. He opposed further in allowing a dental hygienist to administer local anesthesia and nitrous oxide without a dentist present. He stated that the public could be harmed should such changes be made.

Dr. Handelin spoke in opposition of (1)(b & c), as it specifically relates to orthodontics. He stated that irreparable damage is greatly possible for any work that is not done by a dentist; further that it can cause harm to the public. Lastly, that the ultimate liability falls on the dentist and not the dental hygienist.

Mr. Hunt stated that the Board had three (3) options: Option (1) – a motion can be made for no changes to be made; Option (2) – a motion can be made to approve some changes, or; Option (3) – a motion could be made to vote to adopt all changes. He stated that the Board now needed to delegate. Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel noted to the Board that on new section, currently a dental hygienist can only perform these duties on a patient that is a patient of record and has been seen by the dentist within the last 18 months. Therefore, that it would not be allowed on new patients. Ms. Solie indicated that regarding the authorization in proposed changes to sections (a-r), she inquired if staff could provide the number of complaints regarding any type of anesthetic involved and the risks. Mr. Hunt indicated that they do receive multiple complaints that dental hygienists and dental assistants have been treated by the dental assistant and/or dental hygienist prior to being seen by the dentist. Ms. Solie inquired further on the level of risk involved to the public when a dentist is not present in the office Mr. Hunt stated that the risk level would have to be determined by the Board. He stated that the Board does receive complaints regarding dental hygienists and dental assistants outside their scope of practice. Further, that the number of complaints was increasing regarding the treatment rendered.

Mrs. Villigan stated that and clarified that the regulations proposed were supported by the Dental Hygiene Committee; and further, that the language reads that a dentist 'may authorize', keyword being 'may' and therefore, a dentist may choose to not allow or to allow a dental hygienist to perform the duties being proposed for change. She stated that, ultimately, the dentist is responsible and determines whether or not to allow their dental hygienist to perform certain duties without their presence.

Dr. Sill indicated that under the proposed section (5) dental hygienists would be allowed to perform those duties without supervision, and stated that he did not see it to be in the best interest of dentist or the public. He further stated that he concurred with the examples provided by Dr. Twesme. He opposed the changes.

Ms. Guillen commented in regards to the new section, (1)(b &c c), and how dental hygienists wants to work in conjunction with the dentist as far as healthy tissue for the patient, and as for removing sutures, she noted that dental hygienists spends two years in tissue assessment. She stated that there can always be infections, or other issues, but that it does not make them incapable of properly performing such a task. She indicated that she believed that dental hygienists can tell if something is not right which would let them know to notify the dentist. She stated that Cytological testing and bleaching is being done by a lot of dental assistants, though legally they cannot. She noted that nitrous oxide can be complex, but that every individual has their own comfort level.

Mr. Hunt stated that they were all valid points, but that ultimately the Board must decide what would be in the best

interest of the public.

Mrs. Wark stated that as the public member, she was not in favor of these changes.

MOTION: Mrs. Wark made the motion to oppose the proposed changes. Motion failed to pass.

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\*c. Request to Amend Disciplinary Stipulation approved by the Board on October 3, 2014 regarding probation (For Possible Action)

#### (1) Marianne Cohan, DDS

Board Counsel went over the provisions of the proposed stipulation agreement. He advised that it would not be appropriate to change the stipulation agreement that had already been approved at a previous board meeting. He added that the only exception has been to add time for licensee to make the payments. Board Counsel commented that the Board must act in a manner that protects the interest of the public.

MOTION: Dr. Kinard made the motion to reject the request to amend the previously approved stipulation agreement. Motion seconded by Dr. Sill. All were in favor of the motion.

\*d. Request to Amend Disciplinary Stipulation approved by the Board on July 31, 2015 regarding Probation & Inactive practice (For Possible Action)

# (1) Travis M Sorensen, DDS

Board Counsel went over the provisions of the proposed stipulation agreement. He stated that Dr. Sorensen was present, which he then approached the Board. Mr. Hunt went onto note that Dr. Sorensen has recently entered into a stipulation agreement, and further noted that at the time had an attorney when he entered into said stipulation agreement. Mr. Hunt recapped for the Board that Dr. Sorensen had admitted to being under the influence while practicing. He added that, historically, such acts have resulted in a revocation of licensure. He commented that the Board has been very understanding. Mr. Hunt noted to the Board that Dr. Sorensen did not report to the patch program the day before the meeting, which the stipulation agreement requires that he report to the patch program; and therefore, Dr. Sorensen was technically in violation of said stipulation agreement. He noted further, however, that Dr. Sorensen reported to a testing facility upon arriving in Reno and tested negative. He reminded the Board that it was their duty to protect the public. Dr. Sorensen commented to the Board that he was in route to Reno from Las Vegas. He indicated that the Options program notified Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel that they were unable to reach him and that upon him speaking with Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel he asked her if she wanted to try and get a lab analysis done in Reno upon his arrival. He added that Options Program advised him to obtain a time stamped receipt showing his whereabouts at the time they spoke. Furthermore, that she contacted a lab in Reno at 6:49 p.m. and requested a lab with an extended panel, and asked that they email the results to her and Mr. Hunt. There was discussion regarding the death of a former patient, Mr. Sorensen stated that through the course of an investigation he was cleared of any wrongdoing or mistreatment. (Documents and information were disseminated for the record.) The Board took a few minutes to read the information provided. Dr. Sorensen indicated that he was requesting that the probation time be time-served, and be terminated tomorrow, 9/19/2015. Further, Dr Sorensen added that he provided Option (1) and Option (2) [provided for the record]. Mr. Hunt stated that regardless of what the board decides, it is still reported to the National Practitioners Data Bank (NPDB). Mr. Hunt advised the Board that it was his legal opinion that should the Board agree to change the terms to be time served would be a terrible decision, and advised that the Board should reject the petition, as the actions that led to the stipulation agreement were gross actions. Dr. Sorensen stated that his actions while, indeed, are of public concern and that patients should be aware, he did not feel that the board rejecting his petition would create a safe haven for other dentists with similar issues to feel comfortable to come forward and make the appropriate changes to seek help. Dr. Twesme, as the original investigating officer for the case, stepped forward and commented on behalf of his investigation. He stated that he felt that Dr. Sorensen was rehabilitated and has complied with all the provisions in his stipulation agreement. He stated that because of the report provided to the NPDB, Dr. Sorensen is essentially unemployable, because the insurance companies will not contract with him and that any dentist that hires him run the risk of losing their contracts with insurance companies. He stated that as the former investigative officer, he asked that the Board remove the term "probation" from the stipulation agreement. Dr. Kinard inquired of Dr. Twesme if he would hire Dr. Sorensen. Dr. Twesme replied that he would, however, that in doing so he would be hired as in independent contractor but would not be able to get paid because insurance companies will not contract him, and reiterated that because of the probation provision in Dr. Sorensen's stipulation agreement, any dentist that hires Dr. Sorensen will

run the risk of losing their contract with insurance companies. Essentially, Dr. Sorensen would have to be paid on a fee-for-service basis.

Mr. Hunt stated that the Board has been remedial, and that they have also been consistent in their decision making. He commented that the severity of the scenario could have been fatal, and this so-called minor change would be irreparable. He stated that the Board had the duty to enforce the stipulation agreement as approved. He added that at the time the stipulation agreement was approved, Dr. Sorensen had an attorney present at the Board meeting that the stipulation agreement was approved. Dr. Blasco inquired if Dr. Sorensen checked with insurance companies to see if they would consider him eligible to become a provider if they were to remove the term 'probation' from the stipulation agreement. Dr. Sorensen stated that they have verbally indicated that they would contract with him. Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel commented that she works closely with insurance companies, and they terminate contracts with providers at their discretion and pursuant to the terms of the contract, and noted that insurance companies have been known to terminate contracts with licensees that have a corrective action non-disciplinary action. Therefore, removing the term 'probation' would still not guarantee that the insurance companies will make Dr. Sorensen a provider, that they have only stated they he may apply to become a contracted provider. Dr. Blasco inquired if Dr. Sorensen was eligible to apply for licensure in another state. Dr. Sorensen stated that he was upon agreeing to certain terms made confidentially with him and the other board. Mr. Hunt explained to Dr. Sorensen that he did have the option to voluntarily surrender his license at any time, which would not keep him from ever being able to return to Nevada and applying. Mr. Hunt commented to Dr. Sorensen, whom stated that the environment he was in was not an environment that would make other practitioners feel comfortable to come forward and self-report, that the issue was not the self-reporting, but rather that Dr. Sorensen's issues with abuse posed an imminent threat to himself and patients.

MOTION: Dr. Kinard made the motion to reject the request to amend the previously approved stipulation agreement and deny options I and 2. Motion seconded by Mrs. Villigan. Discussion: Dr. Sill was not in favor of the motion. Mrs. Villigan clarified that there were licensees with substance abuse problems in the past who were on probation and employed. Dr. Miller inquired that if Arizona granted Dr. Sorensen a license to practice there, could he not then surrender his license in Nevada. Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel stated that if Dr. Sorensen chose to voluntarily surrender his license she could revise her original report to state that he voluntarily surrendered his license.

Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel stated that Dr. Vincent Colosimo was an example for the Board to consider. She stated how Dr. Colosimo had a substance abuse issue and was actually incarcerated, yet was licensed in different states, Pennsylvania and Arizona, and that he complied with the requirements, and eventually got his Nevada license back. Dr. Sorensen stated that even if he had the money to start his own practice he would sit in an empty office and that the probation provision in his stipulation agreement affected his livelihood.   - (1) Review Draft Balance Sheet and Statement of Revenues, Expenses and Balances for fiscal period ending June 30, 2015 (For Possible Action)

Mrs. Shaffer indicated that Mrs. Hummel was available for any questions. Mrs. Hummel stated that the report was reflective of where the board landed and added that said financials were being audited. She indicated that she would be moving funds over to the reserves account. Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel added that she signed the paperwork to have the funds moved over. Mrs. Hummel requested that the Board approve for her to move \$51,000 to the reserves account.

MOTION: Dr. Blasco made the motion to approve to move \$51,000 to the reserves account. Motion was seconded by Ms. Guillen. All were in favor of the motion.

Mrs. Hummel noted that the Board has a new savings account for operations only, which would hold about \$530,000, added that it would be appropriate to move it from their current checking account.

Mrs. Hummel commented to the Board that she had to adjust totals in some areas of the budget. She added that had to budget new revenue of \$16,000, which derived from site renewals of conscious sedation and general anesthesia permits, for a total adjustments increase of \$43,000.

MOTION: Dr. Miller made the motion to approve the budget. Motion seconded by Ms. Solie. All were in favor of the motion.

(2) Review Balance Sheet and Statement of Revenues, Expenses and Balances for period July 1, 2015 through July 31, 2015 (For Possible Action)

Mrs. Hummel stated that the review was only available for the month of July. No questions were asked.

(3) Request approval to upgrade telephone system to State of Nevada (For Possible Action)

Mrs. Shaffer indicated that the Medical Board has two office locations and that they looked into methods to save on operational costs for their telephone system because they were paying long distance fees. She added that they have become part of the state system, and added that the data line used is in the Dental Board office. Therefore, the Medical and Dental Board would split costs for the data line and to upgrade the phone system, which would make the dental board part of the state phone system. She stated that though this was not a budgeted item, it was still affordable for the Board.

MOTION: Dr. Miller made the motion to approve the phone system. Motion seconded by Mrs. Wark. All were in favor of the motion.

MOTION: Dr. Champagne made the motion to return to agenda order. Motion seconded by Ms. Solie. All were in favor of the motion.

Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel indicated that in AB 89, the Legislature changed the definitions of Minimal and Moderate sedation. She stated that said definitions could be found in their board books, and that they must now make changes and incorporate into the language into the regulations. Dr. Miller stated that in reviewing the proposed regulations it was apparent that they were becoming more contemporary with minimal and moderate sedation, and suggested that the Board create a committee with a moderate sedation holder, a minimal sedation holder, a general anesthesia holder, and include one to two board members to draft language to propose to the board.

Mrs. Shaffer went over the advisory opinion request. Dr. Mackie was present and approached by the Board. Dr. Mackie noted that she was aware that the Board issued an opinion that general dentist may only administer botox for TMJ purposes. Furthermore, that a Oral Maxillofacial Surgeon (OMS) advisory opinion determined that an OMS may only administer if they can furnish proof that they have had the proper training. Dr. Mackie gave a description of her educational background. She added that her request was to ask that the Board allow a prosthodontist administer Botox, dermal fillers, and other injectable for both therapeutic and aesthetic purposes. She read her request into the record. Mr. Hunt noted that for the Boards' edification, that the original advisory opinion was based in part of the Medical boards' position that Botox was considered to be practicing medicine. And therefore, was unsure if the Medical Board would accept the Dental Boards opinion. Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel commented that the Board must be sure to be clear that inquiry and advisory opinion would only apply to board certified prosthodontists. It was advised that Dr. Mackie seek a medical doctor to request an advisory opinion of the Medical Board to see if they would deem a Prosthodontist use to be practicing medicine.

MOTION: Dr. Miller made the motion to table this agenda item until the Medical Board can give insight on their opinion and to have Dr. Mackie give a similar presentation to the Medical Board. Motion was seconded by Dr. Blasco. All were in favor of the motion.

Mrs. Villigan noted that Mr. Patam stated that he would be willing to take a clinical exam. Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel suggested that the Board could approve the application for licensure contingent upon Mr. Patam furnishing proof that he successfully passed an accepted dental hygiene exam. She added that a skills assessment was not an option, as skills assessments are typical made available to only individuals whom are licensed.

MOTION: Ms. Solie made the motion to approve the application for licensure contingent upon Mr. Patam successfully passing the clinical portion of a dental hygiene exam through WREB or ADEX. Motion seconded by Ms. Guillen. Dr. Kinard advised that Mr. Patam may want to redo the anesthesia exam. AMENDED MOTION: Ms. Solie amended her motion that they Board approve the application for licensure contingent upon Mr. Patam successfully completing the WREB or ADEX exam, and assuming that three are no other reasons for rejection. Ms. Guillen agreed to amend her second in favor of the amended motion. All were in favor of the motion; Dr. Blasco abstained.

She stated that in surgeries and dental procedures, sometimes complications do occur and noted that they do not have a profession for an error free field; with that being said they are all held to a higher standard because of it. She commented that the ultimate goal was to work together as a dental team. She added that she saw that the Boards' main topics of concern were supervision over general supervision, responsibility, liability, and protection for the public. Ms. Failing urged the Board to consider the requiring that the dental hygienists and dental assistants carry malpractice insurance. Furthermore, she urged the Board to have all parties involved to work together to see how they can make the practice better and less risky. She thanked the board for having the courage and the foresight to be collaborative.

 Mrs. Lincicome commended the dental hygiene committee for their hard work and diligence in pushing for the changes discussed at the workshop.

Elizabeth Bruins thanked the board for approying her PHE application.

Ms. Mackenzie stated that she was representing the public. She noted that the board is charged with protecting the public. She pleaded that they consider the public that is left unserved. She stated that approximately 169,000 people in Nevada did not have health insurance, and therefore asked that they take the underserved into consider when they consider expanding functions. She asked that the Board help dental hygienists in being able to provide the public in need to not be left unserved.

Note: No vote may be taken upon a matter raised under this item of the agenda until the matter itself has been specifically included on an agenda as an item upon which action may be taken. (NRS 241.020)

10. <u>Announcements:</u> Mrs. Shaffer-Kugel announced that the newsletter was being finalized and would be mailed by October 1<sup>st</sup>. That new computers were being installed and that the additional scanner has been ordered.

Dr. Miller stated that this was, potentially, the last meeting for Mrs. Wark, Dr. Sill and himself. He thanked staff and counsel for all their support.

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#### MANAGEMENT'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

This section of the Nevada State Board of Dental Examiners' (Board) annual financial report presents our discussion and analysis of the Board's financial activities during the fiscal year then ended June 30, 2015. Please read it in conjunction with the Board's financial statements which begin immediately following management's discussion and analysis.

#### FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

- The Board's assets exceeded its liabilities by \$562,672 (net assets) for the fiscal year reported. The comparison with last year shows an increase of 55% when assets exceeded liabilities by \$363,699.
- Total assets include cash, accounts receivable, and prepaid expenses which represent an increase of 32%.
- Total liabilities, which include deferred revenue of the Board, increased by 19% from \$1,547,319 to \$1,836,632.
- Total net assets are comprised of the following:
  - 1. Unrestricted net assets of \$562,672 represent the portion available to maintain the Board's continuing obligations and operations.
- Operating expenses were \$917,315 during the current year.

#### Overview of the Financial Statements

The annual report consists of three parts - management's discussion and analysis (this section), the basic financial statements and notes to the financial statements which explain some of the information in the financial statements and provide more detailed data.

#### **Board's Financial Statements**

The financial report of the general fund uses a reporting method similar to those used by private-sector companies' accrual basis accounting.

The first statement of the basic financial statement is the Balance Sheet. This statement includes all of the Board's assets and liabilities with the difference reported as Fund Balance. Over time, increases or decreases in the Board's Fund Balance are an indicator of whether its financial health is improving or deteriorating, respectively.

The second statement is the Statement of Revenues, Expenses and Fund Balance which reports how the Board's Fund Balance changed during the current fiscal year. Current year revenues are the result of the recognition of previously received cash from licensing activities as well as user fees and charges, and interest income. Expenses are included regardless of when they are paid for in cash. The design of the statement of revenues, expenses and fund balance is intended to show the financial reliance of the Board's activities on revenues generated by the licensing process.

The third statement, Statement of Cash Flows, summarizes the changes in cash balances by category. These changes are derived from the collection of cash receipts and disbursement of cash payments.

The Board's financial statements reflect operations that are primarily supported by business-type activities

intended to recover all or a significant portion of their costs through licensing fees and charges. Board activities include the regulation and licensing of dentists and dental hygienists.

The Board has implemented GASB Statement No. 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, as amended by GASB Statement No. 71, Pension Transition for Contributions Made Subsequent to the Measurement Date.

#### Financial Analysis of the Board as a Whole

By accumulating year-to-year financial information, changes in fund balances may be observed and used to discuss the changing financial position of the Board as a whole.

Net assets at fiscal year-end are \$561,973 which is an increase of \$198,274 from last year's net assets of \$363,699. The following table provides a summary of the Board's net assets:

For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015, the Board experienced an increase in total revenue from \$1,011,097 in the prior year to \$1,116,288. This increase was due in part to an increase in license applications and licensees fee.

### Financial Analysis of the Board's Funds

As the Board completed the year, its general funds (as presented in the balance sheet on page 6) reported a fund balance of \$562,672 which includes applications for licensing of dentists and dental hygienists and receipt of other required fees.

### **Capital Assets**

The Board's purchases of capital assets include computer hardware, communication equipment, and office equipment. In accordance with its charter, the Board does not maintain ownership of the assets but they immediately become the property of the State of Nevada. As such, purchases of capital assets are accounted for in the statement of revenues, expenses and fund balance under the account "Equipment". Purchases for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2015 were \$1,021.

## Economic Factors and Next Year's Budgets and Rates

The Board increased its revenue budget for FY2016 over the FY2015 budget by 5% to better align with expected income. The Board increased wage/benefit and professional fee expenses for FY2016 to better align with fixed costs and increases in managing investigations, legal costs, and general costs of doing business. The Board increased licensing fees for limited licenses and anesthesia site permits. A new fee was added for infection control inspections to align with anticipated expenses for the inspections. It continues to maintain cost allocation and recovery for regulatory enforcement. The Board has continued to manage negotiated leases, travel expenses, collaboration with other boards for expense savings, and other cost saving measures.

The Board has maintained a modest reserve account for legal and disciplinary processing and prosecution as well as unanticipated legal contingencies. The number of investigations, informal hearings, formal hearings and prosecutions has again increased in addition to more involved litigious issues associated with the investigations and hearings and the ongoing monitoring associated with compliance in stipulation orders.

Biennial renewal for all unrestricted licensees of dentistry and dental hygiene continues. Biennial renewal requires close budgetary monitoring and accumulated funds management. Ongoing efforts to modernize and improve technical communications continues in FY2016 with website improvements, ongoing identity verification, in-house background checks for applicants, archival of existing file data, online renewal along with a disciplinary tracking system for monitoring all investigations and stipulation agreements, on-line jurisprudence examination for all applicants/licensees and continued development of the licensing system. Online address change capabilities are available to all licensees. Online disciplinary actions and malpractice claim information associated with licensees is also available with a link to the actual order of the Board describing circumstances resulting in a stipulation agreement through the licensee search and verification on Board's website. Technical Bulletins noting action taken by the Board regarding unlicensed persons practicing dentistry and/or dental hygiene in the State of Nevada is available on the Board's website. Biennial newsletters are now being produced and mailed to all licensees. Lastly, the Board's website now contains the Board's Agendas. Minutes, and Public Materials dating back to January 1, 2012 for immediate review/download by the public or licensees and advisory opinions issued by the Board can be reviewed and/or obtained on the Board's website as well.

#### INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Nevada State Board of Dental Examiners (a Nevada State Agency) which comprise the balance sheet as of June 30, 2015, and the related statements of revenues, expenses, fund balances, and cash flows for the year then ended and the related notes to the financial statements.

## Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

### NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### **NATURE OF ACTIVITIES**

Nevada State Board of Dental Examiners (the Board) is the licensing and regulatory agency for dentists and dental hygienists in the State of Nevada. The Board was created and is regulated by the Nevada Revised Statues. The Board is a special revenue fund of the State of Nevada that is used to account for the proceeds of licensing fees that are legally restricted to expenditures for specified purposes. The Board is required to comply with budgeting and reporting requirements in the same manner as other state agencies.

#### BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. This method provides for recognizing expenditures at the time the related liabilities are incurred, while revenues are recorded when earned, measurable and available to finance expenditures of the fiscal period.

#### PROPERTY AND EQUIPMENT

The property and equipment of the Board is considered to be general property and equipment of the State of Nevada and, therefore, is not reflected in this balance sheet. Equipment purchases of the Board are charged to expenditures at the time of acquisition.

#### STATEMENT OF CASH FLOWS

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, the Board considers all highly liquid debt instruments purchased with a maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

#### **INCOME TAXES**

The Board is a public agency and is not subject to Federal Income taxes under Code Section 115(7), 1454.R.C.

#### **DEFERRED REVENUE**

By provision of statute, the Board administers its licensing registration on a biennial basis with offsetting years between the dentists and hygienists. Deferred revenue consists of license fees that are collected prior to July 1 for the ensuing year. At June 30, 2015, deferred revenue consists of one year collected fees for the hygienists and two years for the dentists. License fees are the Board's primary source of revenue.

#### **ESTIMATES**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE

The Board carries its accounts receivable at cost less an allowance for doubtful accounts. On a periodic basis, the Board evaluates accounts receivable balances and establishes an allowance for doubtful accounts, based on history of past write-offs and collections. The Board considers all accounts receivable at June 30, 2015 to be fully collectible and, therefore, did not provide for an allowance for doubtful accounts. For the year ended June 30, 2015, the Board wrote off \$3,500 as uncollectible bad debt.

### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (CONTINUED)

### NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

#### PENSION EXPENSE

Financial reporting information pertaining to the Board's participation in the Public Employees' Retirement System (PERS) is prepared in accordance with Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) Statement No. 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, as amended by GASB Statement No. 71, Pension Transition for Contributions Made Subsequent to the Measurement Date.

The fiduciary net position, as well as additions to and deductions from the fiduciary net position, of PERS have been determined on the same basis as they are reported by PERS. The financial statements were prepared using the accrual basis of accounting. Employer contributions are recognized when due, pursuant to formal commitments and statutory requirements. Benefits and refunds of employee contributions are recognized when due and payable in accordance with the statutes governing PERS. Expenses are recognized when the liability is incurred, regardless of when payment is made. Investments are reported at fair value on a trade date basis. The fiduciary net position is reflected in the measurement of the Board's net pension liability, deferred outflows and inflows of resources related to pensions, and pension expense.

### NOTE 2 - CASH DEPOSITS IN EXCESS OF INSURED LIMITS

The Board maintains cash balances with Wells Fargo Bank. Balances are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation up to \$250,000. Wells Fargo Bank, NA is collateralizing the balances in excess of \$250,000 as the Board is a participant in the Nevada State Treasurer's Pool Collateral Program in accordance with applicable Nevada Law.

#### **NOTE 3 - CONTRACTS**

The Board has an agreement with Kaempfer Crowell to provide lobbying services during legislative sessions. The agreement is renewed annually and provides for a monthly fee of \$1,500 for services.

### **NOTE 4 - LEASE AGREEMENTS**

The Nevada State Board of Dental Examiners leases office space and certain equipment under operating lease agreements with various expirations. Aggregate future minimum lease payments required on all operating leases as of June 30, 2015, are as follows:

### NOTE 5 - DEFINED BENEFIT PENSION PLAN

Plan Description. The Nevada State Board of Dental Examiners contributes to the Public Employee's Retirement System (PERS), a cost-sharing, multiple-employer defined benefit pension plan administered by the State of Nevada. PERS provides retirement and disability benefits, annual cost-of-living adjustments, and death benefits to plan members and beneficiaries. The State of Nevada issues a publicly available financial report that includes financial statements and required supplementary information of PERS. That report is available at www.nvpers.org.

Funding Policy. The Board is enrolled in the employer-pay contribution plan. In this plan, the Board is required to contribute all amounts due. The contribution requirements of plan members and the Board are established under Chapter 286 of the Nevada Revised Statutes. The Board's contribution rate for the year ended June 30, 2015 was 25.75%. The Board's contribution to PERS for the year ended June 30, 2015 was \$62,703.

Pension Liabilities, Pension Expense, and Deferred Outflows of Resources and Deferred Inflows of Resources Related to Pensions. At June 30, 2015 the Board recorded a liability of \$429,013 for their proportionate share of the net pension liability. The net pension liability for the plan in total was measured as June 30, 2014 and determined by an actuarial valuation as of that date. The Board's proportionate share of the total net pension liability was based on the ratio of our actual contributions of \$62,350 paid to PERS for the year ended June 30, 2014 relative to the actual contributions of \$1,514,633,045 from all participating employers. At June 30, 2014, the Board's proportionate share was .00412%.

For the year ended June 30, 2015, the Board recognized a pension expense of \$56,842, their proportionate share of the total pension expense.

#### **Actuarial Assumptions**

Actuarial valuations of PERS involves estimates of the reported amount and assumptions about probability of occurrence of events far into the future. Examples include assumptions about future employment mortality and future salary increases. Amounts determined regarding the net pension liability are subject to continual revision as actual results are compared with past expectations and new estimates are made about the future.
