RE: Nevada's Regional Technology and Innovation Hub (Supercharging Nevada's Lithium Batteries

and Other Electric Vehicle (EV) Materials Loop)

Dear Assemblywoman Monroe-Moreno and Chair,

On behalf of the 60+ members and partners of Nevada's Regional Technology and Innovation Hub Consortium, it is my pleasure to provide you and the Members of the Interim Finance Committee with this letter. As you and Members of the Interim Finance Committee are aware, Nevada's Regional Technology and Innovation Hub, *Supercharging Nevada's Lithium Batteries and Other Electric Vehicle (EV) Materials Loop*, received approval and designation by the U.S. Economic Development Administration on October 23, 2023. Beginning on October 23, 2023, members of the Nevada Tech Hub Consortium began working together on developing our shared \$75 million over a five-year period Phase 2 U.S. Economic Development Administration Regional Technology and Innovation Hub application, an application that is due by February 29, 2024, at 4:59 pm EST. Nevada is uniquely positioned to be the only state to offer the nation a true 'cradle-to-cradle' opportunity to ensure long-term national security in the lithium battery, other critical elements, and other EV materials sector.

The Nevada Tech Hub's mission is to aggressively pursue targeted new business creation and attraction and existing business retention and expansion strategies to close 'gaps' in the supply chain of Nevada's emerging lithium batteries, critical elements, and other EV materials industry sector while purposefully supporting broad workforce development strategies, deploy-to-market research and innovation activities, commercialization and entrepreneurship development, infrastructure, community capacity, and housing development, and meaningful engagement with Nevada's Native American and Tribal communities and other underrepresented populations. This mission can only be achieved and further realized through the continued collaboration and partnership among the Nevada Tech Hub's 60+ Consortium members and partners, members that collectively represent all of Nevada's 17 counties. Since October 23, 2023, Nevada Tech Hub Consortium members have worked hard and closely to develop our shared Phase 2 \$75 million over five-year application for the U.S. Economic Development Administration. Over the next five years, we plan to invest these federal resources across the entire state in six broad project areas, including: (1) Supply Chain Enhancement, (2) Workforce Development, (3) development of the Lithium Campus, (4) Accelerated Commercialization and Entrepreneurship, (5) Infrastructure, Community Capacity, and Housing improvements, and (6) development and implementation of the new Nevada Native Nations Center. Each project area will support broad new business creation and attraction and existing business retention and expansion efforts with the larger goal of creating 50,000 new jobs in this emerging sector over the next five years. Implementation of numerous actionable items and individual strategies will span extraction, processing, advanced manufacturing, recycling, and even renewable energy production across the entire state and in each of Nevada's 17 counties.
