What is Parole?

- Parole is the conditional release from prison.
- The Court determines the initial parole eligibility.
- ☐ Parole is an act of grace.




What does the Parole Board do?


- Responsible for making decisions to either grant or deny parole.
- Return offenders to prison whenever community safety is threatened.
- Independent body.





Public Safety Management Team





Parole Supervision

- Control and supervision of offenders.
- Monitoring of the offender's home, job, activities and associates.
- Drug testing & treatment, residential confinement, no contact with victims, requirement to pay restitution.



Parole in the Judicial System

- Legal framework that empowers judges, prison officials and parole boards.
- A flexible system for punishing offenders and protecting the public.



Parole Hearing Types

- Discretionary Parole Hearings.
- Mandatory Parole (MPR) Hearings.
- Geriatric Parole Hearings.
- Reconsideration Hearings.
- Parole Violation (PV) Hearings.
 - Temporary Revoke & Reinstate
- Early Discharge Hearings.
- Lifetime Supervision Hearings.



The Nevada Parole Board FY2023 Caseload

- □ Frequency of meetings. NRS 213.131(3), "Meetings to consider prisoners for parole may be held semiannually or more often, on such dates as may be fixed by the Board...."
- □ Between July 2022, and June 2023, the Board made 5,902 actionable final decisions.
- ☐ Each decision requires at least 4 votes. This equates to over 23,608 votes per year!
- □ When including hearings that did not result in a final parole decision, the Board held approximately 6,912 hearings in FY 2023.

AB32 was passed during the 82nd Legislative session removing the 30-day Revoke and Reinstate affective July 1, 2023.



82nd Legislative Session Bills

Direct Impact on Parole Board

□ AB 32

Effective July 1, 2023

- Board no longer sets supervision levels for parolees.
- Non-Technical Violations.
 - ☐ Special Sex Offender Conditions.
 - ☐ Termination of a Program.
- Technical Temporary Violation Revocations
 - \square 1st Temporary Revocation = 90-days.
 - □ 2nd Temporary Revocation = 180-days.
 - \square 3rd or Subsequent Temporary Violations = Full Revocation.
- Award Credits for Time Served.



82nd Legislative Session Bills

Direct Impact on Parole Board (Cont.)

□ AB 462

Effective October 1, 2023

- Created Executive Director.
- Amends NRS 213.
- □ AB 479

Effective July 1, 2023

- Replacement of All Desktop Computers with Laptops, Update Network Equipment and Update Software Licenses.
- □ SB 67

Effective May 23, 2023

- Revised Definition of Sexual Offense to be Consistent with All Sections in NRS 213.
- Sexual Offense Meaning Ascribed in NRS 179D.097.
