The Kirk Kerkorian School of Medicine at UNLV, the University of Nevada, Reno School of Medicine, interdisciplinary partners within each respective institution, and partner teaching hospitals and clinics, are helping patients and saving lives while training current and future healthcare professionals, conducting cutting-edge research, and caring for the most complex patients.

Graduate Medical Education (GME), one facet of academic health, has the capability to create a lasting impact on the health of a state by increasing the number of high-quality physicians. In addition to the highly-skilled physicians who supervise residents and fellows while providing care to the community, 55% of individuals remain and practice in the state in which they complete their GME.
