Current Challenges

- Physician supply, especially in rural settings
 - Opportunity: rural residency tracks and loan repayment
- Fragmented healthcare systems
 - Opportunity: support for Academic Health
 - UNR Med/Renown and KSOM/UMC
- Lack of growth in GME programs to attract our graduating medical students
 - Opportunity: increase State funding





Fiscal Priorities

- Graduate Medical Education
- Academic Health
- Nevada Center for Patient Safety and Simulation
- Additional Programs:
 - UNR Med and UNLV: increased support for student success (learning specialists, career advising)
 - UNR Med: new/expanded Master's Degree programs in Speech Pathology, Medical Laboratory Science, Clinical Trials Administration
 - UNLV: continued support for increased class size





Policy Priorities

- Sustained and reliable funding for GME at the two public medical schools and affiliated partners
- Streamline licensing for MDs and Medicare credentialing of providers in Nevada
- Improve clinician access to private insurer panels
