HRSA Early Childhood Comprehensive Systems (ECCS) Health Integration Project The Children's Cabinet	Health Resources Services Administration, Early Childhood Comprehensive Systems Grant — is a five-year (August 2021 to July 2026) grant administered by The Children's Cabinet. The purpose of HRSA ECCS Project is to build an integrated maternal and early childhood system of care in Nevada that is equitable, sustainable, and comprehensive that promotes early developmental health and well-being. The project also seeks to increase family-centered access to care and engagement of the prenatal to age three population. The Nevada Early Childhood Family Leadership Council was established as part of this initiative to ensure that parents and families of young children have a voice and decision-making power in the early childhood system. There are currently two NECFLCs in Nevada, one in the North and one in the South. Participants meet monthly to receive training and technical assistance on early childhood systems issues, network
