STATUTE OF LIMITATIONS

Currently the statute of limitations for filing a criminal complaint against a contractor is 2 years pursuant to NRS 171.090

Except as otherwise provided in NRS 171.095, an indictment for:

- 1. A gross misdemeanor must be found, or an information or complaint filed, within 2 years after the commission of the offense.
- 2. Any other misdemeanor must be found, or an information or complaint filed, within 1 years after its commission.
- * Changes to this statute would require legislative approval.



NSCB CRIMINAL COMPLAINT

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Nevada Revised Statute (NRS), 193.167, permits an enhanced penalty, if the crime is committed against a person 60 years of age or older.

Does your case qualify for the enhanced penalty provisions of the Nevada Revised Statute? YES N

NRS 193.167- Certain crimes committed against person 60 years of age or older or against vulnerable person:

Taking money or property from the person of another,

against any person who is 60 years of age or older or against a vulnerable person shall, in addition to the term of imprisonment prescribed by statute for the crime, be punished, if the crime is a misdemeanor or gross misdemeanor, by imprisonment in the county jail for a term equal to the term of imprisonment prescribed by statute for the crime, and, if the crime is a felony, by imprisonment in the state prison for a minimum term of not less than 1 year and a maximum term of not more than 20 years.

Contracting without a license is a crime in the state of Nevada.

NRS 624.700 - It is unlawful for any person or combination of persons to engage in the business or act in the capacity of a contractor within this state or submit a bid on a job situated within this state without having an active license.

UNDERGROUND ECONOMY TASKFORCE

ONGOING TASK FORCE MEETINGS REINFORCE IMPORTANCE OF PUBLIC OUTREACH & COLLABORATIVE EFFORTS

The purpose of the Underground Economy - Interagency Task Force is to facilitate cooperation and coordination amongst the various agencies and stakeholders in the State of Nevada to better help protect our citizens from illegal construction activities (i.e. unlicensed contractors/unpermitted-uninspected work, fraudulent or deceitful acts, embezzlement, abandonment, substandard work, theft/unemployment insurance fraud, diversion of monies, unsafe job sites).

APPLYING FOR A LICENSE

Important Requirements:

- Must pass trade and law exams
- Must demonstrate financial responsibility
- Must prove years of experience in licensed construction field

Misrepresentation of <u>experience</u> or <u>criminal history</u> may be grounds for denial of a license and/or the issuance of an Administrative Citation.

AB 22 CEASE AND DESIST ORDERS

BILL – AB 22

NRS – 624.212 Orders to Cease and Desist

SUMMARY - Revises provisions governing the actions the Board is authorized or required to take after the issuance of a cease-and-desist order for unlicensed activity.

IMPLEMENTATION & UPDATE – Implemented October 1, 2023

To date, although this bill has reduced the penalties for first time offenses of unlicensed contractor throughout the state, it has not impacted the overall goals and strategy of the NSCB. Investigators have continued to prioritize and address unlicensed contracting on a multitude of levels to protect consumers and licensed members of the industry and continue to bring forth cases involving theft and fraud.

AB 23 INFORMAL CITATION CONFERENCES

BILL – AB 23

NRS – NRS 624, NRS 624.302, NRS 624.345, NRS 624.351

SUMMARY – Revises provisions relating to the resolution of certain administrative citations through an informal citation conference.

IMPLEMENTATION & UPDATE – Implemented October 1, 2023

To date, this bill has been extremely effective in helping to timely resolve administrative citations and provide clarification to licensed and unlicensed contractors regarding best practices and regulatory requirements under NRS 624. It has also improved the efficiency of disciplinary processes and minimized unnecessary hearings, fees and costs.

INFORMAL CITATION CONFERENCES

Effective October 1, 2023

Allows for administrative citations to be affirmed, amended or withdrawn.

AB 27 MANAGEMENT & COUNSELING SERVICES

BILL - AB 27

NRS – NRS 624.215

SUMMARY – Revised provisions relating to contractors who provided management and counseling services on construction projects by requiring a general building contractor who provides management and counseling services on a construction project to have an active license in the same classifications or subclassifications that are required to be held by the prime contractor.

IMPLEMENTATION & UPDATE – Implemented May 23, 2023

To date, this bill has helped provide clarification and defined requirements for general building contractors who were previously performing these functions outside their respective classifications.

AB 29 FALSE OR MISLEADING STATEMENTS

BILL – AB 23

NRS - NRS 624.3016

SUMMARY – Revises the grounds for disciplinary action against a licensed contractor who provides a false or misleading statement in connection with the application of another.

IMPLEMENTATION & UPDATE – Implemented October 1, 2023

To date, this bill has effectively been used by members of the NSCB licensing and investigative staff to deter licensed contractors from providing fraudulent or misleading statements to assist others in obtaining licensure without having proper experience because such acts can now result in an administrative citation or other disciplinary action being taken against them.

AB 39 RESIDENTIAL CONTRACTS

BILL – AB 39

NRS – NRS 624, NRS 624.3016

SUMMARY – Establishes mandatory elements to be included in contracts for work concerning certain residential improvements and provides for disciplinary action for failure to comply.

IMPLEMENTATION & UPDATE – Implemented October 1, 2023. Also posted on homepage of NSCB website

To date, this bill has effectively been introduced as part of an overall strategy to improve consumer protections for the public with respect to residential construction. Since its implementation, workshops, webinars, industry bulletins, association meetings and other measures have been taken to continuously update and advise members of the public, licensees, and industry representatives regarding its implementation and requirements.

AB 39

RESIDENTIAL IMPROVEMENTS

CONTRACT CHECKLIST

For home improvement projects

CONTRACTOR INFORMATION Company name, address, license number(s), monetary limit(s)
HOMEOWNER INFORMATION Name, mailing address, physical address/legal property description
PROJECT INFORMATION • Date of contract • Estimated completion date

- Description of work to be performed
- · Total amount of contract, including taxes
- · Notice of the Board's Residential Recovery Fund
- Any change orders agreed upon by the owner and contractor must be incorporated into the contract and include all changes in scope and price of work
- · Ensure all permits are obtained

PAYMENT INFORMATION

- Down payment cannot exceed \$1,000 or 10% of contract price, whichever is less. A down payment may only exceed this amount if the contractor posts a Consumer Protection Bond with the Board in the amount of \$100,000, or if the contractor was previously granted relief of the requirement to post a license bond. You can check your contractor's bond status on the Board's website.
- Schedule of progress payments (not to exceed 100% of contract value). This excludes finance charges & initial down payments or deposits made. Not required if Consumer Protection Bond is obtained.

AS THE PROJECT OWNER, YOU ARE ALLOWED:

- · To initial all contract provisions agreed upon.
- . To contact an attorney for an explanation of your contract rights.
- To ask for written contract in the language used to explain the contract.
- To receive legible copies (physical or electronic) of all signed documents and a written receipt.
- . To modify the contract to ensure compliance with the law.
