Nevada Faces Hunger Crisis

The Food Bank of Northern Nevada is currently helping a record 153,000 people each month. This number represents more than a 42% increase over our service numbers during the height of the pandemic. Nearly half of those served are children and seniors and the numbers continue to climb.

A Perfect Storm

- Pandemic TEFAP commodities are ending. The Food Bank will see 3 million less pounds from this program next year with the loss of COVID funding and since trade mitigation support.
- High cost of living in our area is resulting in more food insecure working families.
- Ending of pandemic SNAP supports in spring of 2023 have led to more families and seniors reaching out for food assistance.
- Of those served by the Food Bank, 41% have had to choose between food and housing costs.
- Nearly 30% have had to choose between food and medical costs or prescriptions.
