ADVISORY COUNCIL MEMBERS

The Advisory Council consists of the following members:

- The dean of each duly accredited medical school in this State;
- The dean of each duly accredited school of osteopathic medicine in this State;

Gubernatorial Appointees:

- Two licensed physicians;
- One representative of hospitals in counties whose population is less than 100,000;
- One representative of hospitals in counties whose population is 100,000 or more, but less than 700,000;
- One representative of hospitals in counties whose population is 700,000 or more;
- One representative of the medical corps of any of the Armed Forces of the United States;
- One representative of the Department of Health and Human Services;
- One representative of the Office of Economic Development; and
- Two appointees deemed necessary by the Governor to carry out the Council's duties.

POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE ADVISORY COUNCIL

The Advisory Council shall meet at the call of the Chair as often as necessary. The Advisory Council is to:

- 1. Evaluate applications for competitive grants for the Graduate Medical Education Grant Program established to make recommendations to OSIT concerning the approval of applications for such grants. In evaluating and making recommendations concerning such applications, the Advisory Council shall give priority to the award of grants for the retention of programs in this State for residency training and postdoctoral fellows when the federal funding for the support of such programs expires.
- 2. Study and make recommendations to OSIT, the Governor, and the Legislature concerning:
 - A. The creation and retention of programs in this State for residency training and postdoctoral fellows that are approved by the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education or its successor organization; and



B. The recruitment and retention of physicians necessary to meet the health care needs of the residents of this State, with the emphasis on those health care needs.

BACKGROUND

LEGISLATION

Senate Bill 350 (2023) created the Advisory Council.

REPORTS TO THE LEGISLATURE

On or before October 1 of each year, OSIT is to submit a written report to the Governor and the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau which must include, without limitation:

- (a) Information on the Graduate Medical Education Grant Program established pursuant to Section 5 of this act; and
- (b) Any recommendations regarding graduate medical education in this State, including, without limitation:
 - (1) The creation, expansion, and retention of programs in this State for residency training and postdoctoral fellows; and
 - (2) Methods by which this State may recruit and retain physicians necessary to meet the health care needs of the residents of this State.

The Advisory Council on Graduate Medical Education has not previously been reviewed by the Sunset Subcommittee.
