# Terms

In-person voting process includes:

- Check-in kiosk
- Voting system
- Tabulators

Mail voting process includes:

- Mail ballot drop boxes
- Mail ballot sorters
- Mail ballot envelope signature scanners
- Mail ballot tabulators
- Signature curing and ballot tracking applications



# Statutory Authority

## Statutory Authority:

- Help America Vote Act (HAVA) of 2002
  - EAC established
  - EAC created Voluntary Voting System Guidelines (VVSG)
- NRS 293B
  - NRS 293B.063: No mechanical voting system may be used in this State unless it meets or exceeds the standards for voting systems established by the United States Election Assistance Commission (EAC).
- February 10, 2021 - the EAC's Commissioners unanimously adopted the newest VVSG standard, version 2.0.
  - *No devices have been created to the VVSG 2.0 standard as of 2024.*



# 2017 to Today

- 2017 Legislative Session
  - AB519 - Makes an appropriation to the Secretary of State to provide grants of money to the counties in this State for the purchase of voting machines.
    - \$8MM total
    - Clark – not more than \$4,500,000
    - Washoe – not more than \$1,700,000
  - Must be SOS Certified systems
    - Only DVS and ES&S applied
    - Both American owned/based

# 2017 to Today

- 2018
  - 16 Counties – Dominion Voting System (DVS)
  - 1 county (Carson City) – Election Systems & Software (ES&S)
- 2021/2022
  - Lander County transitioned to ES&S
    - Commissioners approved \$223,000 for voting machines and \$69,000 for maintenance, installation and training.
- 2024
  - 4 Counties transitioned from one DVS component (VVPAT) to another (BMD)

  - Ballot Marking Devices (BMD)

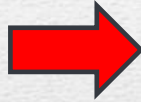

# Election Solutions & Software (ES&S)

## ExpressVote Auditing

### PAPER BALLOT CARD

- Provides a verifiable paper vote record for every voter, containing both human-readable selections and corresponding machine-readable barcodes
- Can be read by any ExpressVote unit before tabulation to verify the voter's intent was captured accurately

### IS THE PAPER FROM THE EXPRESSVOTE AUDITABLE?

Yes. Just as hand-marked paper ballots can be inspected or audited by hand or by machine, so can ballot cards. A ballot card contains the same data as a hand-marked ballot, displayed in different ways. During a post-election hand-count audit, selected candidate names are used to count the vote.

ES&S fully supports the use of paper ballots and post-election audits to ensure accuracy and increase confidence in our country's election process. ES&S views paper records as critical for auditing. A physical paper record of the selected candidate names provides the means to a statistically valid post-election audit.

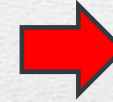
