#### Nevada Food Security Strategic Plan

The Council is currently tasked with overseeing the implementation of the 2023 Food Security Strategic Plan.

We are also working to oversee the implementation of goals in the Food Security Action Plan in the State Health Improvement Plan

The plan demonstrates a continued commitment to lead conversations with a broad set of food security ecosystem stakeholders and create ideas to build the capacity of agencies tasked with this work.

The pillars in the plan are designed to address the root causes of hunger and to generate a healthier food security ecosystem.

#### 2023 Food Security Pillars

Lead	Systems change to improve food security through greater collaboration, information sharing, and policy development efforts.
Feed	Nevada's population at increased/higher risk for food insecurity.
Grow	Nevada's local food sources.
Reach	Population in Nevada that are experiencing food insecurity and/or are at an increased/higher risk for food insecurity with nutrient-dense, affordable, and culturally appropriate foods.
Build	Nevada's food security ecosystem by increasing capacity and education.

## Goals and Objectives

- Lead Enhanced cooperation, communication, and representation to support policy development and resource utilization.
  - Objective: Improve collaboration, communication, coordination, and information-sharing among food ecosystem partners.
    - Strategy: Organize and host an annual Food Security Summit/Conference.

- In 2024, the Council will continue to focus on the execution of the Food Security Strategic Plan and the State Health Improvement Plan Food Security Action Plan.
- Focus on distribution, support, and general food access.
- Targeted collaboration with our State and local partners Home Feeds Nevada and Transportation.
