

History of SNAP





Purpose of SNAP

- Provide means to increase food purchasing power.
- Raise the nutritional level among low-income households.
- The first line of defense against hunger for millions of families.



Factors of Eligibility

- Residency
- Identity (for the head of household)
- Age (Certain policies allow for specialized budgeting in relation to age)
- Household Composition
- Relationship
- Citizenship
- Social Security Enumeration
- Income

Food Insecurity

- Federally Funded to assist income eligible households purchase food.
- The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) defines food insecurity as a lack of consistent access to enough food for an active, healthy life.
- Studies show that 1 in 8 individuals in Nevada face food insecurity.



Ways to Reduce Food Insecurity

- DWSS will be requesting a waiver to complete telephonic signatures on SNAP applications.
- DWSS is exploring participation in the Restaurant Meals Program (RMP), which allows elderly, disabled, and unhoused eligible SNAP households to use their SNAP benefits at participating restaurants.
