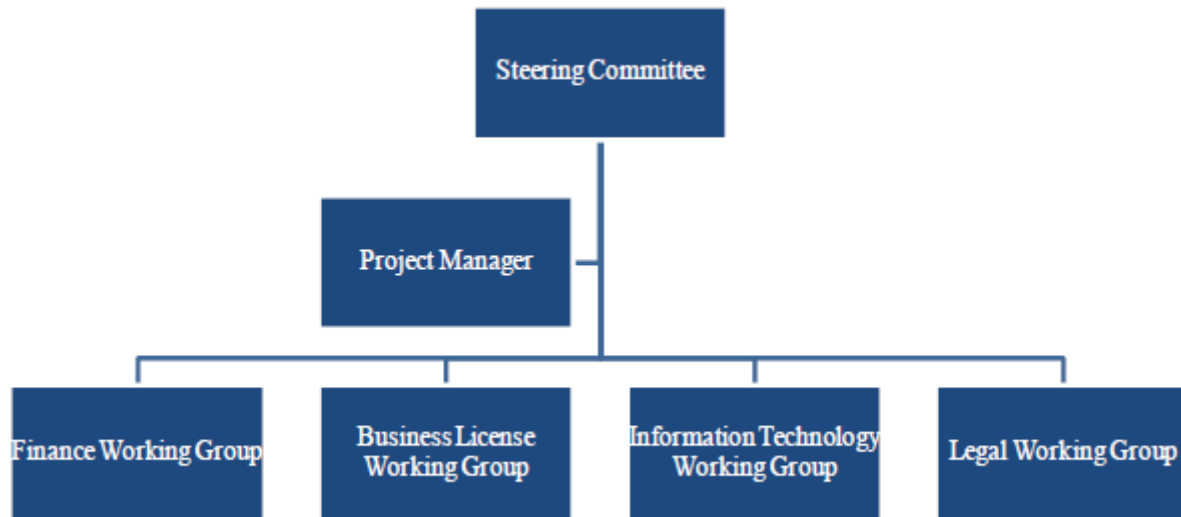
What is Multi-Jurisdictional Business Licensing (MJBL)?

- A business license category that allows a business to apply in one jurisdiction but operate in participating multiple jurisdictions with one license.
- Today only one category exists: Nevada State Contractors
- Participating jurisdictions:
 - Clark County (CC)
 - City of Las Vegas (CLV)
 - Henderson (COH)
 - North Las Vegas (NLV)

How it started

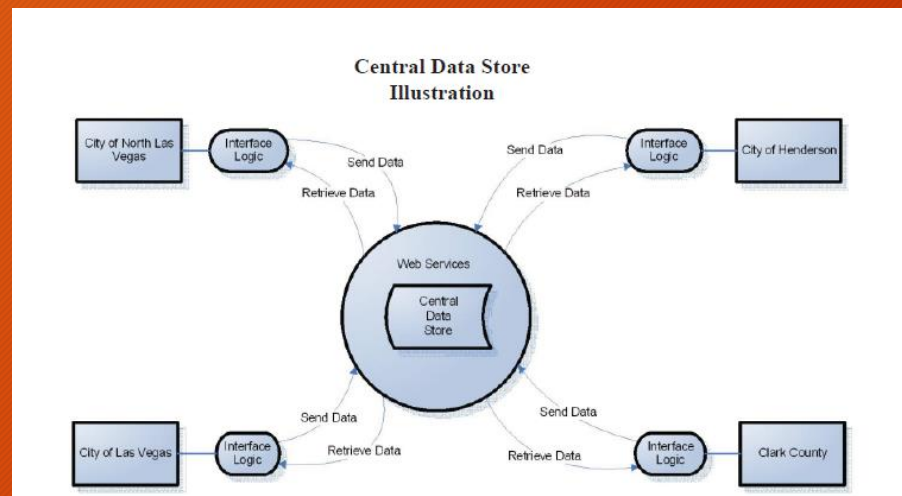
- Senate Bill 110 (76th Legislative Session) 2011 required CC, CLV, COH, and NLV to establish a business license type that would allow State licensed contractors to operate under one license by June 17, 2012.
- A steering committee was established to get all four entities to work together to put this in place.

How it started



What it takes to make it work

- A data exchange from each entity is required
- The Central Data Store (CDS) was developed and is still used today
 - Hosted by City of Henderson
 - Paid by each entity through an Interlocal agreement



What it takes to make it work

- Updates to ordinances
- As each jurisdiction changes their licensing systems they have to ensure they account for the interface to the CDS
- Each jurisdiction must also match renewal periods
- Applicant starts in their primary jurisdiction and can add/subtract the other jurisdictions to their primary license
- Initial implementation was tracked with an unfunded \$1.4 M (approx.) cost associated

2012-2021 - CLV update

- CLV was also transitioning to a new licensing platform that went live in 2014
- There were a lot of bugs to workout with the new MJBL process between entities and then in the new system
- Transitions in management
- Discussions on adding categories with the other entities
- Talks with NVSOS on the rise

2012-2021 - CLV update

- There has been a lot of work and discussion with the Nevada Secretary of State's portal for integration at various levels
- City of Las Vegas was working closely with NVSOS to have some integration on the SilverFlume portal.
 - SilverFlume was
 - To leverage data from GIS and incorporate CLV as part of the Checklist
 - To create a custom CLV payment confirmation template with link to CLV Application
 - To consume data from weekly report and display CLV license status and renewal date on checklist
 - To enhance CBR report and include fields specific to CLV
- The IT person we were working with left and project halted
